Leader: Beloved in Christ, let us offer our prayers for the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world.

Leader: For the whole People of God, that each one of us may be a true and faithful servant of Christ, let us pray to the Lord.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: For Sean our Presiding Bishop, for Phil our Bishop, for Lynne our Priest; for all the ministers and people of St. Paul's, remembering especially this month all who serve in parish life ministries; and for all who serve in God's church, let us pray to the Lord.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: For our country and for every country, that justice and mercy may flourish everywhere and that we may all live together in peace, freedom, and hope, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For our families and friends, that the Lord will give them joy and satisfaction in all that they do, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For the special needs and concerns of this community. For all who suffer in any way in body, mind or spirit; for all whose suffering is known to you alone; especially remembering those we name now, either silently or aloud *(pause)*...

For all who travel, near or far, especially those we remember now, either silently or aloud *(pause)*....

For all of the blessings of this life, especially giving thanks for those joys we name now *(pause)*... let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For all who have died, that they may be received into God's Kingdom, and that God will comfort all who mourn. We especially remember our own beloved dead, either aloud or in the silence of our hearts *(pause)*... let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

The Presider adds a concluding Collect.

Confession & Absolution (from *Enriching Our Worship*)

Presider: Let us confess our sins to God.

People: God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.

Presider: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer 1 (Enriching our Worship)

<i>Celebrant</i> The Lord be with you. <i>Celebrant</i> Lift up your hearts. <i>Celebrant</i> Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. <i>People</i> It is right to give him thanks and praise.	<i>People</i> And al - so with you. <i>People</i> We lift them to the Lord.
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It is truly right, and good and joyful, to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. You have filled us and all creation with your blessing and fed us with your constant love; you have redeemed us in Jesus Christ and knit us into one body. Through your Spirit you replenish us and call us to fullness of life. Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we sing:

Sanctus

S-124

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah, you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Presider and People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your children, that with Paul and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory and praise, for ever and ever.



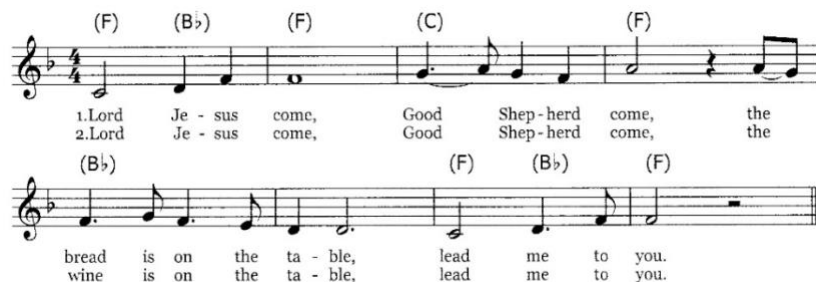
