

Spiritual Direction Opportunities in the Port Townsend Area

With deep roots in the contemplative Christian tradition, spiritual direction provides attentive companionship for people on their spiritual journey. It is open to anyone seeking to become more aware of and responsive to the presence and call of the Holy in their lives. A trained guide listens and accompanies the directee, asking reflective questions, witnessing moments of spiritual awareness, and encouraging healing and growth. Direction typically takes place in monthly one-with-one settings but can also happen in a group setting. Directors may also be available for leading contemplative retreats.

People seek spiritual direction for a variety of reasons, including a desire to:

- become more attentive to the presence and action of the Holy in their lives
- integrate spirituality into daily life
- discern and make choices or navigate transitions with deeper spiritual awareness
- share disappointments, struggles or losses in a receptive, loving, spiritually attentive environment
- find encouragement for faithful living
- maintain healthy life balance
- explore ways of praying that nurture the divine-human relationship.
