Albert Isaac Slomovitz earned a Ph.D. from Loyola University of Chicago in ethnic history. He was the Senior Chaplain at the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida. Rabbi Slomovitz retired from the Navy and is the Founding Rabbi of Congregation Gesher L'Torah in Alpharetta, GA., and a Professor of American History at Kennesaw State University. He is the author of two books, "The Fighting Rabbis: Jewish Military Chaplains and American History" and "America's Other Clan: The United States Supreme Court".
