A Florida born/Brooklyn-based director, theater practitioner, creative producer and filmmaker, Tatiana's work often centers on women's stories and the intersections between identity, gender, and power. She has written, directed, produced and performed live theater in New York and Florida, to name a couple.

In Tampa Bay, she has performed at Ruth Eckerd Hall and the Straz Center. In 2015, Tatiana was awarded the Jeff Norton Dream Grant to develop "Ghost Player," a play about the BRCA gene's effects on a group of Ashkenazi Jewish women. In 2017, Tatiana launched "Private Revolution," an online platform broadcasting women openly discussing their sexual and reproductive health in companionship with "Late," a short film she wrote, directed and produced that examines a quiet crisis many women face: pregnancy scare.

Tatiana received her BFA from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts.
