COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Bench Dedication to Scoutmaster Don Logsdon Sr.:

A group of Scouters decided to undertake a project of dedicating a bench to recognize the contribution of their Scoutmaster Don Logsdon Sr. who served as Munster Scoutmaster from 1957 -1965 for Troop 1331 (64 years ago) during which approximately 30 Scouts in his troop achieved the Eagle rank.

The installation ceremony was held on October 27, 2023 at the Munster Community Park, 8601 Calumet Avenue, Munster behind the Munster Public Library on Calumet Avenue. The commemorative bench was located next to the Munster Lions Club in the park. The Munster Lions Club sponsored the local Scout troop for many years. The Scout troop participated in many conservation projects planting and cultivating trees in the early years of the park. Many outdoor Scouting events were held at the Munster Community Park.

The Munster Scout Troop had over 60 boys and six patrols. The troop camped every year summer, winter, and fall. Every summer the troop went to Camp Betz in Berrien Springs, Michigan. Scoutmaster Logsdon was awarded the highest honor for a lay person, the Silver Beaver Award.

The Munster Lions Club was the sponsor of the Munster Scout Troop during this time. The Scout Troop supported many community projects sponsored by the Munster Lions Club including conservation projects at the beginning of the Munster Community Park, many pancake breakfasts, turkey shoots, and marching in many civic events including Munster parades on Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Veterans Day.

The installation event commemorated Scoutmaster Donald Logsdon's contribution to the Munster Scouting program, to the Munster community, and the influence Scouting had on so many former Scouts scattered throughout the United States. By his example of good citizenship many former Munster Scouts developed a sense of public service to their local community, conservation ethics, and an appreciation for outdoor skills.

Rechartering:

Gentle reminder to please finish your unit recharter process. There is no rechartering code needed. The Internet Rechartering 2.0 is the same process as last year. Units should collect registration fees and submit those payments online or directly to the Council office. The charters are due no later than December 31, 2023. All leaders must have their Youth Protection Training up to date before rechartering. If you know of any units that are not rechartering and if you have any questions regarding the recharter process, please contact your Unit Commissioner, District Commissioner, or District Executive. 


