ABOUT THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Construction Industry Dinner Show is the largest single fundraising event for the benefit of the Pathway to Adventure Council, Boy Scouts of America. Proceeds from this event help bring valuable youth service programs to over 15,000 young people annually.

In 2007, the Executive Committee of this event initiated a Scholarship program in memory of 2 key former volunteers. In 2012, the committee lost another key member and decided to honor him through this program as well. Proceeds raised from this effort go directly to defray college or higher education costs of the selected recipients.

Marc' Coffey was a long-time employee of Bovis Lend Lease. Marc' was instrumental for many years in raising hundreds of thousands of dollars to support Chicago area Scouting, and as a result, positively impacted the lives of thousands of youth.

Herb Church was the former General Manager and Vice President for Turner Construction in Chicago and was a leader of the Executive Committee for this event. He was a Good Scout Award recipient and was diligent in supporting urban Scouting initiative of the Pathway to Adventure Council for many years.

Harold Schiff was a pioneer in the area of construction management. He brought projects like the Willis Tower (than Sears) and Grand Central Terminal to life. Although his work took him around the world he was never too busy to invest his time in Chicago's youth. His recognitions in Scouting started in '83 with a Good Scout Award, then in '93 a Torch of Gold and in '94 a Silver Beaver.

Michael Hughes was the last living founding member of the dinner committee. In 2020, we lost this kind soul who advocated for Scouts his entire life. His 50+ plus years in the construction industry gave rise to Huen Electric and countless projects including Wrigley, Millennium Park and Navy Pier. His service to Scouting included being honored with a Silver Beaver during the time he served as Board President.

The recipient of this award last year received \$1,000 and will continue to receive \$1,000 for the next three years provided he stays in school and remains in good standing. The amount given each year may vary and is determined by the Approval Committee and based upon funds received.

- 0 Make sure that the application has been signed where indicated by you, your parent/guardian, and school official.
- 0 Use the enclosed Personal Recommendation Forms to obtain **one** letter of recommendation from individuals knowledgeable enough about you both academically and personally, to provide insight into your personal characteristics, abilities, achievements, motivation and potential. **The recommendation letter must be from a teacher, school official or someone whom you have worked with in a community, church, or employer.** Before you decide on your evaluator, read the Personal Recommendation Sections carefully to help you understand the type of information required. When you make the request of your evaluator, be sure he/she feels comfortable about completing the form.
- 0 Complete a brief essay, limiting your response to no more than **200 words**. Your essay should be typed or computer printed, using black ink. Be sure to use a font size no smaller than 10 point (this size).
- 0 Obtain an Official Transcript of Grades from your school.
