Safeguarding Youth Training (SYT) is replacing Youth Protection Training (YPT). Scouting America has updated this training receiving input from respected experts in child safety, law enforcement, and child psychology, Scouting America is committed to creating a safe and secure environment for all.

This training is mandatory for all registered adult leaders. The duration of the training is 90 minutes. It is available in English and Spanish. It is required to complete all lessons and score 80% or higher on the final test. After completing the full course once, a 15-minute refresher and retest is required every year to stay current.

All volunteers will be required to take the new Safeguarding Youth Training within the next 12 months.

Recruitment Readiness

July Membership Article

Welcome to your July monthly Membership newsletter article. As we welcome summer's arrival, this month's article will touch on Membership Renewal, National Night Out and Fall Recruitment Readiness. There will be additional information shared on our Membership Website, August PTAC Newsletters and during our Roundtable Kick-offs. This year's recruitment theme is, **"Adventure is Calling! – We're Ready, Are You?"**

Membership Renewal Update: Please remember that Membership Renewal is an ongoing monthly process. If your unit has any members in their "Lapse Period", your District or Unit Commissioner, District Membership Chair, District Chair and / or your DE will be reaching out to you asking, "How Can We Help". The purpose of this contact is to assist our units to ensure that no Scout or Scouter was inadvertently dropped off your roster.

National Night Out (NNO): This year, the 2025 National Night Out will be on **Tuesday, August 5th**. This is an excellent opportunity to use this event as a "springboard" for your Fall Recruitment since there will be at least 45 Illinois cities and 5 NW Indiana cities participating within PTAC. Please go to the NNO website (<https://natw.org>) if you have any questions or to see if your city is participating as new cities register on a regular basis. Please work with your District Membership Chair and DE to get materials for this community event.

Fall Recruitment Readiness: At our Roundtable Kick-offs, we will stress the importance behind preparing for Fall Recruitment. The first step any unit should take is to ensure that your BeAScout Pin is active and current, which includes all pertinent contact information. Most important, your Pin Mode should be set to "Allow Units to Update Pin information" so you can make the necessary updates. If your pin is set to "Council Mode", please reach out to your District Membership Chair, your District Executive, or myself (arrek1@hotmail.com) so we can change this designation to allow your unit to make all updates to your unit's pin.

Next, please continue to address your online Leads and Applications in a timely manner. For your Leads, please respond to those families within 72 hours and if necessary, follow up with those families in a week if they do not answer your initial response. We need to remember that we cannot make a second first impression. The purpose behind this lead is that families are actually recruiting your unit as their child wants to join Scouting.

This year, there will be flyers, postcards, bookmarks, stickers and gliders with the new graphics. Our Packs will have access to Yard Signs that will have the option to attach a flyer on the backside. Our new families will receive a Welcome Kit, that will be mailed to their home, once their application is processed. Within these Welcome Kits, families will be given information and stickers that can be used to recruit their friends. Please attend your Roundtable Kick-off so you can learn about and obtain all our new recruitment materials.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for all your hard work and dedication to ensure our youth, and their families can experience a Quality Scouting program. Please remember, a successful recruitment program, for both youth and adults, should be 24/7 as it can take multiple contacts to recruit a new family to join Scouting. Please read future newsletters, visit our Membership Website, and attend your District Roundtables for additional information. 
