PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

By the time you receive this, you will have heard the good news: the BSA's bankruptcy reorganization plan has been approved on appeal. It is good to have that almost behind us. Time to refocus and rebuild.

Every strong structure has a cornerstone. Sometimes the cornerstone needs to be reinforced to ensure sustainability of the edifice. Pathway's cornerstone needs reinforcement. Today I am pleased to share with you the broad contours of Pathway's 5 year strategic plan, Reinforcing the Cornerstone.

The plan is based on the work of three task forces, each chaired by members of our Executive Board:

Marketing: Goals include developing innovative consistent core messaging for each of our target audiences (Scouts, families and benefactors), efficient and effective distribution through mainstream and social media, empowering districts and units to amplify the message, and operating on a test and learn basis.

Fund Development: Near (18 mo.) and longer term (5 year) mission-focused goals include re-engaging our closest friends, connecting with new benefactors (individuals, foundations, government agencies), assigning accountable champions for every initiative, and measuring progress.

Strategic Plan: In addition to the foregoing, the plan is designed to achieve growth in membership recruitment and retention, financial stability (realigning our relationships with key financial institutions, appointing an Investment Committee of the Executive Board, creating an investment policy, and rethinking FOS, all with a better than break even mentality), world class programming and unique events, strong chartering relationships, and Council leadership succession.

Our staff are developing metrics for tracking our progress toward attaining each of these goals and will be assigning responsibilities for their accomplishment. Each of you - our leadership groups, districts, units, volunteers and Scouts - will have a role in achieving these goals and Reinforcing Pathway's Cornerstone.

Throughout this process, we will continue growing together and remain open to all.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Youth Protection Training Policy

The Youth Protection Training policy that took effect on 01/01/2023 has been a success. PTAC was 89% YPT compliant in January 2023 and ranked 194 out of 248 councils. Thanks to former Council Commissioner, Diane Kloepfer, and Director of Field Service, Mike Hornung, who purged the list, PTAC reached 100% YPT compliance by March 1st and ranked #1 out of 248 councils who reached 100% YPT compliance.

Safety in Scouting

There is an emphasis on Safety Moments. Safety Moments are brief discussions or training sessions on a particular subject for safety preparation or review usually provided in the beginning of a meeting. It is not only for Roundtable Commissioners to teach on safety, but the Unit Leaders should also focus on safety moments in their meetings before camping or participating in an activity.



ADVANCEMENT WEBINAR ON AUTISM

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a neurological condition that affects how the brain operates and impacts many aspects of life. In general terms, autism affects communication and social skills, the perception of risk, the ability to self-organize, and how sensory input is managed.

It has been estimated that somewhere between 1 in 15 and 1 in 20 Scouts are on the spectrum. This means most Scout units have one or more Scouts on the spectrum. Join us on April 20 at the PTAC Advancement Webinar where we will discuss the characteristics of autism and the strategies for making the Scouting program work for these youth.
