Built in 1922, Phillips Middle School was first known as North Junior High. The building served the Fort Dodge Community School District until 2014. In 2018, The Phillips Luxury Apartments opened, but the auditorium was left intact. In 2019, the Fort Dodge Fine Arts Association and current owners, Foutch Brothers LLC, formed a partnership to renovate the space to serve the community.
