Dear Parents/Guardians,

October 20 was the National Day of Writing, and was celebrated by our students and staff in the English Department. This day is an initiative of the National Council of Teachers of English — built on the premise that writing is critical to literacy and needs greater attention in our students' studies.

As the National Council see it, people tend to think of writing in terms of “pencil-and-paper assignments,” but no matter who you are, writing is part of your life. October 18 was the 100th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of PMHS and the 243rd anniversary of the Battle of Pell's Point. Back then, The Town of Pelham voted to build a new high school as the old location at present-day Siwanoy was overcrowded.

The new building was named the "Memorial High School" in honor of all of those who fought and died in

World War I, which ended one year before construction started. The Memorial Tablet, listing all men from Pelham who served in the armed forces during World War I, was later installed in the lobby of our high school where it remains today.

Social Studies teacher Mr. David Accocela facilitated this centennial celebration for our school. He made available replica copies of the original program from that day as well as copies of an article on the Battle of Pelham.

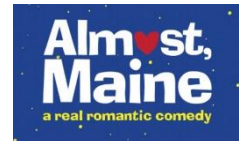

On **October 7**, The Westchester County Board of Legislators proclaimed October as Italian Heritage and Culture Month in Westchester County at a special program in Legislative Chambers in White Plains. At the ceremony, students and teachers from the 17 legislative districts in Westchester were honored for their outstanding commitment to promoting the Italian language and culture. Representing Pelham in District 11 were Senior Bernadette Russo and Italian teacher Mrs. Prignano. Our congratulations to both.

On **October 10**, students in our French Syracuse University Project Advance (SUPA) class attended the French Institute: Alliance Francaise (FIAF) to see the award-winning musician, dancer and choreographer Olivier Tarpaga make his highly anticipated New York premiere of *When Birds Refused to Fly* (*Quand les oiseaux refusent de voler*).

Set to a powerful soundtrack by Tarpaga's father's band, Super Volta — combining traditional sounds from Burkina Faso and driving contemporary rhythms — this athletic dance piece compares the celebratory post-independence fervor in the 1960s Sub-Saharan Africa to the fight for Civil Rights in the United States. While the choreographer spoke English, the four

Burkinabe dancers from Ouagadougou only spoke in French.

Many SUPA French students took the opportunity to speak French to the organizers at the FIAF and participated in the scheduled Q & A. After the performance, our group surrounded the dancers and engaged in an interactive educational Q & A in French. After the show, students enjoyed a French lunch at La Bonne Soupe.

On **October 21** Pelham Memorial High School students Matthew Cannella (teacher Elizabeth Caparotta) and Bernadette Russo (teacher Christina Prignano) were honored for their outstanding performance in their study of Italian at the Westchester County Executive Proclamation Ceremony at Eastchester High school.

The ceremony occurs each October and is sponsored by the Westchester Coalition of Italian American Organizations in collaboration with the Italian Club of Eastchester High School.
