Cameron Akioka, 19, graduated from Palo Alto High School this year and is currently pursuing an English and Piano Performance degree at Rice University. She studied with Olya Katsman for eight years and now studies with Jon Kimura Parker at Rice's Shepherd School of Music.

In June, Cameron opened and closed an episode of NPR's "From the Top" at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Most recently, she was inducted into the Young Artist Guild of the MTAC and was awarded first prize in the Pacific Musical Society Competition, silver medalist at the San Jose International Piano Competition and a

winner in the Young Pianists Beethoven Competition. Cameron has previously been named a winner of the Sturm-Page Piano Scholarship and the Ross McKee Competition. In 2016, she was awarded a full scholarship in the National Chopin Scholarship Foundation. Her past awards include first place in the State California Association of Professional Music Teachers (CAPMT) Concerto Competition and first place in the Solo Competition at the CAPMT State Convention. Cameron was also awarded first prize at the State MTAC Piano Solo Competition and the Menuhin-Dowling Young Artist Competition.

She is an avid chamber musician and participated in her third season with the Young Chamber Musicians of Burlingame last spring. Her most recent chamber group, Trio Sonoro, won 2nd prize at the Galante Prize Competition in San Francisco. Cameron has attended several summer music programs, including California Summer Music in Sonoma, Music@Menlo and Tanglewood Young Artist Institute. This summer, she participated in the Yellow Barn Young Artists Piano Program in Vermont and performed two world debuts of original compositions.
