✠ THE LESSON Proverbs 4:10-18

Summary

Lector Today's lesson outlines two contrasting paths: the way of wisdom, leading to life, and the way of wickedness, leading to ruin. The lesson urges listening to instruction for a blessed life, avoiding the treacherous path of evildoers, and highlights that righteous living grows brighter, while wickedness leads to darkness. Now, the lesson from the book of Proverbs in the Old Testament.

Lector ¹⁰ Hear, my child, and accept my words, that the years of your life may be many.
¹¹ I have taught you the way of wisdom; I have led you in the paths of uprightness.
¹² When you walk, your step will not be hampered, and if you run, you will not stumble. ¹³ Keep hold of instruction; do not let go; guard her, for she is your life.
¹⁴ Do not enter the path of the wicked, and do not walk in the way of evildoers.
¹⁵ Avoid it; do not go on it; turn away from it and pass on.

¹⁶ For they cannot sleep unless they have done wrong; they are robbed of sleep unless they have made someone stumble. ¹⁷ For they eat the bread of wickedness and drink the wine of violence. ¹⁸ But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, which shines brighter and brighter until full day.

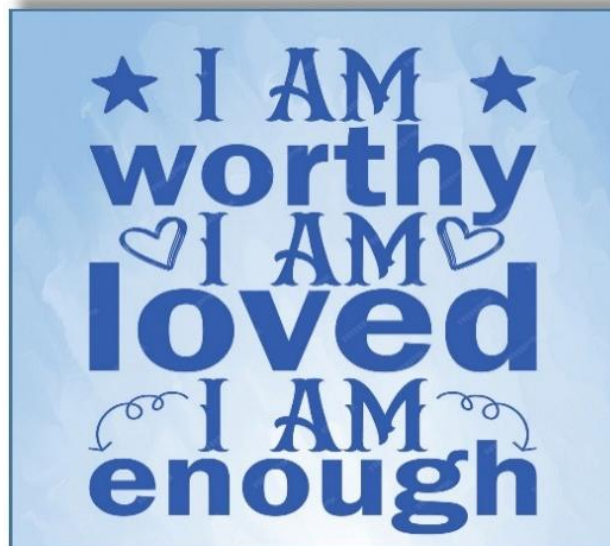


Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (WELCA)

- **God’s Gardeners** – has an opportunity for you to help beautify the Church grounds by being part of the “Adopt-a-Spot” program. What this entails is a once or twice a month commitment to clean, weed, and plant flowers in a spot on the Church grounds. Some areas to adopt include:

1. Flower beds in front of the bushes on each side of the Front “red” door going into the Narthex;
2. Flower beds along the drive by the canopy where you enter the church to the business offices;
3. Circle beds of flowers that are by the Welcome Center entrance

Volunteers are also needed to weed in the parking lot across the street.
