

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

✚ THE FIRST LESSON Isaiah 42:1-9

Summary

Lector *Today's first lesson reveals that God's servant is endowed with God's spirit to bring justice to nations. The servant will not exercise authority boisterously or with violence, nor will weariness ever prevent the fulfilling of the servant's task. God's old promises have been fulfilled; the servant's new assignment is to bring light to the nations. Now, the first lesson from the Old Testament Prophet, Isaiah.*

Lector ¹Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. ²He will not cry out or lift up his voice or make it heard in the street; ³a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. ⁴He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice on the Earth, and the coastlands wait for his teaching. ⁵Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the Earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: ⁶I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, ⁷to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. ⁸I am the Lord; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. ⁹See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

✚ THE SECOND LESSON

Romans 6:1-14

Summary

Lector *Today's second lesson emphasizes that because Christians are united by Christ's death and resurrection, they are spiritually dead to sin's power and alive to God, in a new transformed life. Now, the second lesson from the book of Romans in the New Testament.*

Lector ¹⁻³ So what do we do? Keep on sinning so God can keep on forgiving? I should hope not! If we have left the country where sin is sovereign, how can we still live in our old house there? Or did you not realize we packed up and left there for good? That is what happened in baptism. When we went under the water, we left the old country of sin behind; when we came up out of the water, we entered the new country of grace—a new life in a new land! ³⁻⁵ That's what baptism into the life of Jesus means. When we are lowered into the water, it is like the burial of Jesus; when we are raised up out of the water, it is like the resurrection of Jesus. Each of us is raised into a light-filled world by our Father so that we can see where we are going in our new grace-sovereign country. ⁶⁻¹¹ Could it be any clearer? Our old way of life was nailed to the cross with Christ, a decisive end to that sin-miserable life—no longer captive to sin's demands! What we believe is this: If we get included in Christ's sin-conquering death, we also get included in his life-saving resurrection. We know that when Jesus was raised from the dead it was a signal of the end of death-as-the-end. Never again will death have the last word. When Jesus died, he took sin down with him, but alive he brings God down to us. From now on, think of it this way: Sin speaks a dead language that means nothing to you; God speaks your mother tongue, and you hang on every word. You are dead to sin and alive to God. That is what Jesus did. ¹²⁻¹⁴ That means you must not give sin a vote in the way you conduct your lives. Do not give it the time of day. Do not even run little errands that relate to that old way of life. Throw yourselves wholeheartedly and full-time—remember, you have been raised from the dead!—into God's way of doing things. Sin cannot tell you how to live. After all, you are not living under that old tyranny any longer. You are living in the freedom of God.

Lector Here ends the second lesson. For the word given to us,

Pastor ¹³Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. ¹⁴John would have prevented him, saying, “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?” ¹⁵But Jesus answered him, “Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.” Then he consented. ¹⁶And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God’s Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷And a voice from the heavens said, “This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.”

ALL **I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Pastor Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

ALL **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Pastor You have made a public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve ALL people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in ALL the Earth?

ALL I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Pastor People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?

ALL We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Pastor Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God,

ALL that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in your people the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence both now and forever. AMEN.


