This award-winning facility is named in memory of William Wise, a former member of our congregation. The tour will be hosted by Danny Ware who is currently the CPW/GMD Water Department Director.

The Greenwood Water System is the 12th largest water system in South Carolina. The source of our water is Lake Greenwood. To protect the purity of our water, the water system is monitored and maintained 24 hours a day, seven days a week. In all of the USA, the Greenwood water treatment facility is one of less than twenty water treatment plants that have successfully completed all four phases of the Partnership for Safe Water program and received the Excellence in Water Treatment Award.
