




The Introduction

mazing grace! How sweet the sound. We all know the hymn. It's been a favorite of Christians for a long time. You may be thinking, "That's nice, but what does this song have to do with Christmas?" The truth is, the birth of Jesus is God's amazing grace. Jesus is the embodiment of God's underserved love (that's what grace means), lying in a manger, sent to save a wretch like me, like you. He came to seek and


save the lost. He came to open the eyes of the blind, whose vision of God is clouded by worldly ideals and ungodly ways because of sin.

He came to crush fear and restore our reverence and awe of almighty God. He came to protect us from the power of Satan who wants to pull us away from God's grace. He came to give hope to the hopeless with the promise of eternal life with him where there will be no more crying or pain. And he came to tune our hearts toward him and put a new song in our mouths—a song of praise to our God—a song that all who believe in him will sing around his throne in heaven for eternity. So, what does the hymn "Amazing Grace" have to do with Christmas? Everything! Now let's listen to this good news of Jesus' birth—God's amazing grace in a manger.



I. Amazing Grace that Opens Eyes

- Reader 1 Today is the day! The Savior God promised will soon be born. Bethlehem has waited a long time for this moment. God's prophet, Micah, told everyone that something big would happen here.
- Reader 2 O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days. (Micah 5:2)
- Reader 1 Something big is about to happen here. Or should I say, something small. And God has put everything in place for it to happen.
- Reader 2 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, who was with child. (Luke 2:1-5)
- Reader 1 While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. (Luke 2:1-7)



His cry is a reminder that he will suffer the punishment for all people's sins in order to save them. People have wandered from God's ways. Because of their sin, they're lost and separated from God. They are blind to God's goodness and don't know how desperately they need him. But this child has come to open their eyes and lead people back to God's loving arms, where they will be safe forever. It's just like God's prophet Isaiah said.

Reader 1 Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped ... and the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing. (Isaiah 35:5, 10a)

Reader 2 Amazing grace indeed! Here for ALL to see.

II. Amazing Grace that Crushes Fears



- Reader 1 When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. (Luke 2:8-16)



Reader 1 From his fullness we have ALL received grace upon grace. (John 1:16)


