
DISCOVER THE WONDERS

Known historically as Thebes, this city was once the capital of ancient Egypt and is now celebrated as one of the world's greatest open-air museums. Luxor is home to a plethora of spectacular temples, tombs, and monuments that testify to its rich historical legacy.

The climate in Luxor during August is characterized by extreme heat and arid conditions, dominated by the desert landscape. These conditions are ideal for eclipse viewing, as they significantly optimize the chances of clear skies. Our selected viewing location has been carefully chosen based on historical weather data for this date, ensuring that you will enjoy the best possible experience as the sun obscures the moon.

Luxor offers unique photography opportunities against the backdrop of its ancient structures, allowing enthusiasts to capture stunning images of the eclipse framed by iconic monuments. For those who prefer to immerse themselves in the awe of the phenomenon without the distraction of a camera, the historical significance and archaeological grandeur of Luxor provide a breathtaking setting.

Thursday, July 29 Arrive in Cairo (EGYPT)



Upon arrival in **Cairo**, meet and transfer to *Cairo Marriott Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(D)** *Note: Standard check-in time is 3:00 pm. If you arrive on July 28 or in the early morning of July 29, an extra Hotel night needs to be booked.*

Friday, July 30 <u>Cairo</u>



After breakfast, enjoy a full day tour of the city, starting with a visit to the **El Darb El Ahmar Touristic Road**, where we will see the most mesmerizing monuments of Islamic Egypt from the Fatimid, Ayyubid and Mamluk era throughout Egypt's Islamic history. The monuments include mosques, schools, complexes, palaces and even 700 year old ancient handicraft markets. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant and then, head to the **Citadel of Saladin** overlooking the whole city of Old Cairo, and **Sultan Hassan Mosque**. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Saturday, July 31



After breakfast, begin the day with a visit to Adam **Henein Museum,** a 2014 gift from the artist (1929-2020) to the nation. It is one of the MENA region's most important and ground-breaking sculptors, Henein contributed greatly to Egypt's cultural landscape: in Aswan, which we will visit later in the tour. Henein founded the city's annual international sculpture symposium; from 1989 to 1998 and headed, the design team involved in the painstaking restoration of the Great Sphinx; and represented Egypt at one of the world's most illustrious art exhibitions, the Venice Biennale.in the afteroon head to visit Ramses Wissa Wassef Arts **Centre** (winner of the Aga Khan Award for Architecture) in Harrania and near the Giza Pyramid Complex. Founded as a weaving school in 1951 by the renowened veracular architect Ramses Wissa Wassef (1911-1974), the Centre includes workshops and showrooms, a pottery and sculpture museum, and farm buildings. Constructed entirely of mud brick (adobe), the Centre reflects Wissa Wassef's architectural style that was influenced by the traditional Nubian houses in and around Aswan. Visit the **National Museum of Egyptian Civilization**, the first museum in the Arab world that focuses on the ancient Egyptian civilization across the times from pre-historical to Ancient Egyptian periods, Greco-Roman, Coptic, Islamic & contemporary modern times. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant and then return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, August 01 Cairo - Luxor



After breakfast, transfer to the airport for our flight to **Luxor**, upon arrival, cross the river to Luxor's West Bank to explore the Valley of the Kings. Visit the well-preserved tombs of several rulers of Old Kingdom Egyptian dynasties along with King Tut Tomb. Visit the Mortuary Temple of Queen Hatshepsut (18th dynasty of the Old Kingdom, ca. 1490 BCE), one of Egypt's most successful pharaohs, as well as the longest-reigning female, the temple is also called "El Deirr El Bahari" and Medinat Habu **temple**. Drive back to Luxor and embark on *Queen Farida* Dahabeya & Queen Of Egypt Dahabeya. After lunch, head to visit the Karnak Temple, built between 2055 BC and around 100 AD. It was built as a cult temple and was dedicated to the gods Amun, Mut, and Khonsu and Luxor **Temple**, built in 1400 BCE during Egypt New Kingdom. The first one who built it was Pharaoh Amenhotep III, one of the great builders of ancient Egypt then Tutankhamun (1336-27 BC), then Horemheb (1323-1295 BC) and then finished by Rameses II (1279-13 BC). Return to the Cruise for dinner & overnight. (Boxed B,L,D)

Monday, August 02 Luxor - Esna (Start cruising)



Enjoy a leisurely breakfast onboard, a serene morning that sets the stage for the adventure that lies ahead. As the clock approaches mid-afternoon, gather for an unforgettable experience. As the moon begins its celestial dance to cover the sun, watch in awe as the daylight dims, igniting gasps of wonder. The sky transforms into a masterpiece, filled with vibrant colors, shadows, and ethereal light. Experience the beauty and magic of the eclipse, connecting with fellow travelers in this shared moment of awe. It's not just an event; it's a celebration of nature's splendor, best appreciated in the company of those who share your enthusiasm. As the late afternoon unfolds, set sail toward **Esan** and enjoy an overnight stay onboard. **(B,L,D)**

Tuesday, August 03 Esna - Edfu - Kom Ombo



Enjoy breakfast and set sail to **Edfu.** In the afternoon, have lunch and then head to visit the **Temple of Horus**, the largest temple dedicated to the god Horus. It was built in the Ptolemaic period between 237 and 57 BC. Then head back to the cruise and continue sailing to **Kom Ombo**, an agricultural town in Egypt and was originally known as Nubt, which means "City of Gold," reflecting its historical significance and wealth. Enjoy dinner and overnight onboard. **(B,L,D)**

Wednesday, August 04 Kom Ombo



Enjoy breakfast onboard while sailing to Kom Ombo and upon arrival, head to visit the **Kom Ombo temple**, unique in its dedication to two deities. The most spectacular of the river temples, Kom Ombo is honeycombed with crypts, secret passages, and tunnels under the floors, the source of the gods' human voices. Return to the cruise and enjoy lunch while sailing to **Aswan**. Enjoy a leisurely afternoon onboard, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Thursday, August 05 Aswan



Transfer to the airport for your flight to **Abu Simbel**. The monuments on the bank of Lake Nasser south of Aswan were built by Ramses II (r. 1277-1212 BCE). See the two temples excavated in the mountain by Ramses II to his wife Nefertari in the guise of the goddess Hathor, and to himself. They were moved when the High Dam at Aswan was built to avoid being flooded. Return to Aswan, enjoy lunch at a local restaurant then start your visit by boat ride to explore **Philae Temple** (dedicated to Goddess Isis) and visit the **Nubian Museum**, dedicated to the ancient Kingdom of Nubia. Enjoy a drink on the terrace of the *Old Cataract Historical Hotel*. Transfer to *Movenpick Aswan Hotel* for check-in and overnight. **(B,L)**

Friday, August 06 Aswan - Cairo - USA



Transfer in the early morning to the airport for our flight back to Cairo, and upon arrival meet and head to visit the NEW Grand Egyptian Museum (GEM) with visits to Ramses II Statue, the Hanging Obelisk - 10 Statues of Senusert (from distance), Ptolemaic Statues Victory Column of King Mernpatah, Royal Regalia, the Grand Atrium & the Gift Shop). The visit is escorted by a GEM

guide and joining other groups). Enjoy a late lunch and then head to **Khan El Khalili Bazaar** and walk through the medieval labyrinth alleyways and do some shopping. Dinner and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(B,L,D)**

Saturday, August 07 Cairo - USA



Transfer in the early morning for your flight back to the US. **(B)**


Trip Grade
