THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF THE ARTS IN HEALTHCARE

Arts programs enhance patient care by creating uplifting distractions, fostering a comforting sense of normalcy, and encouraging social connections. Studies suggest that integrating art into healthcare environments provides measurable benefits not only for patients but also for caregivers and staff. Research underscores four major benefits of incorporating the arts into healthcare settings:



- 1. Improved care environment for patients, caregivers, and staff
- 2. Enhanced effectiveness in health communication

- 3. Better outcomes, including reduced anxiety and pain, and shorter hospital stays

This year's annual patient art exhibition, *The Power Within*, celebrates inner strengths like compassion and courage as true superpowers. Guided by AWAHIH Artists-in-Residence, sixteen Wolfson Children's patients reimagined themselves as superheroes, highlighting qualities beyond their diagnoses.

The project empowered pediatric patients to express themselves, enhance their artistic abilities, and build confidence, all of which contributed to their healing process. They tapped into their inner strengths to inspire themselves and others.

Showcased at MOCA Jacksonville and sponsored by the Florida Blue Foundation, the exhibition underscores art's healing power and provides a platform for these young artists to share their work with the community.
