Government Relations

As the VI chapter representative on the AFP Canada Government Relations committee, I kept up with the political advocacy efforts happening at the national level for a secretariat for the charitable sector – a home in government. With a federal election coming up in 2025, the AFP Canada GR committee will be busy engaging with members and political candidates about the critical importance of a secretariat, which will advocate for our sector's needs. Mentorship

The Mentorship Program continued to be sought-after among AFP-Vancouver Island members, with 14 individuals participating in the 2024 cohort, including seasoned professionals and those newer to fundraising. Based on applications mentors and mentees would submit to the program, mentees were paired with a mentor who had strength/experience in at least one of the professional area(s) the mentee was looking to grow. Mentor-mentee pairs then meet once a month, either virtually or in-person, to discuss targeted areas where the mentee is seeking advice and growth, as well as current topics in our field and everyday challenges that arise in our work. While the Mentorship Program remains an asset to the suite of AFP-Vancouver Island membership opportunities, participation was somewhat lower than in 2023 (25 participants total). Opening the application earlier, promoting it more consistently to members leading up to its launch, and recruiting more mentors (finding enough mentors is always a challenge) may help to boost numbers in 2025. Regardless, feedback from mentor-mentee pairs has remained unfailingly positive to-date, and I am confident many will stay in contact beyond the program.

Programming

In 2024, the Programming Committee successfully hosted two in-person events, responding to member feedback prioritizing in-person event opportunities. The first in the summer was our Networking Night: Trials and Triumphs which featured three guest speakers sharing personal stories and professional insights, offering valuable networking opportunities.

In November, we hosted our Social Night: IDEA in Fundraising which provided a space for meaningful discussions on inclusion, diversity, equity, and accessibility (IDEA) in the fundraising sector. The event combined the informal atmosphere of a social gathering while also encouraging focused dialogue.

Though we initially planned a virtual event, logistical challenges led us to focus on in-person programming for 2024. However, we recognize the value of virtual events in expanding reach, enhancing accessibility, and accommodating diverse schedules. Looking ahead, we aim to integrate virtual programming into future events to better serve our membership base.

In addition to event delivery, we created structured planning resources to streamline future event coordination and ensure greater efficiency for upcoming committee chairs.

Scholarships

We are once again awarding the Chamberlain Scholarship and the John Saunders Scholarship to help offset the cost of attending the AFP International Conference (ICON). There is also a scholarship available to cover the cost of the Fundamentals of Fundraising Course, which is scheduled for February 2025. Our deadline is Dec. 13th, 2024 and we already have several applications in. As we move forward, we will continue to refine our efforts and build on these accomplishments to further strengthen AFP VI's commitment to supporting the professional development of our members. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this year's scholarship program, especially the Scholarship committee as well as Julia Keenan and Monica Powell, and we look forward to even greater success in the coming year.
