
Another reason is all of the pandemic protocols and shit downs has taken a toll on small businesses and that has been especially true for people in our industry. It's affected everyone from rancher to yarn store

owners and then of course you. Also I want to see how all this plays out a bit more before bringing someone else into the mix.

I will bring someone in the next few weeks to help with the reeling of the yarn from cones to skeins. It's a time consuming job but super easy and not something that will take up my time monitoring.

Having help with reeling will make a huge difference!! Our reeler, who seriously needs a name, actually broke down recently. Something I've been worried about for awhile since the people who service it are pretty far away. Anyway I am a little more behind of anything sock yarn related than I hoped to be because of that. I am on a mission though so bear with me.

Which brings us to our next issue, emails. It has come to my attention recently that I am not getting some of your emails. I've gotten emails or phone calls basically asking why I am not responding. I went and looked in our system and there are no emails form the person asking. One of you graciously sent me the notices she was getting from the ticket system that looked like they might be a response form me but please know they are not. 
Where I am with orders and clubs.

So the sock club knows where we are so I will leave that out of this update.

I am sending out emails so both the School of Yarn and The Spinning Club about what and when so please look for those. Spinning club fiber is drying in rafters as I type these notes. It's super flipping hot here so... should not take long and the yarn for last school shipment is dyed!! All I have to do is package and ship.

One of the things that have been going on the fiber/yarn front is yarn availability due to mills closing down. Once it opened back up everyone is operating with limited staff and new safety protocols in place. Also there are massive shipping issues. All things are taking longer, they just are. So I am doing my best to plan ahead and





also stay in direct communication with my mills and reps but since we are operating in new and more limiting ways it is a challenge to stay on top of it all. For example there are yarns I almost always get in skeins but because of the supply and demand issues sometimes this is not the case. I place my order and it shows up on cones and not skeins which of course makes more work for me. Also I do not know it's happening until it shows up that way. And

this has happened quite a few times and there is no recourse but to adapt. So we roll with the punches and keep on moving!!

One of the other big changes in our industry at large is the massive production of yarns that are super-washed. So much super-wash yarns on the market. I have one supplier I have worked with for years that I've gotten my Targhee yarns and Woobu and Silk Victoria and that Polwarth yarn we had who is moving into mostly Superwash yarns. I know... it's so sad. I will not get my soapbox out on this right now. One of the main reasons for this current trend is that it's what is selling. So basically you the knitter, crocheter, weaver control this with what you are purchasing. It's most definitely a buyer's market. Also superwash yarns are an easy dye. Speckles work very well on super-wash treated yarns.

What you will see from me as a positive response to this new reality is changing my relationship with ranches and mills to a more direct hands on approach which I will tell you all about in a week. And... a whole lot of promotion of yarns that are wonderful and not super-washed. Along yarns that if they are super-wash treated it's in a more sustainable and limited way that does not strip the yarn of all of its wonderful woolliness and protects the planet and us!!

We am going to start all of this with our beloved Targhee Worsted. Honestly I have felt a little nervous in the past 6 months or so. I'm just waiting on the phone call that says, "hey we are going to discontinue this because of"...and list the reasons. Please know my dear friends that the main reason for this is almost always sales. If it is bringing in revenue they will make it unless there is some sort of mill or ranch production issue. And really if it is bringing in enough revenue they will find a way around the production issues.

So the power is with you my dear knitters. I have not really done a lot of sales or promotions this past year for obvious reasons. However I am close enough to caught up and we need to stay on top of this. We do not want a Woobu or BFL SPORT situation on our hands? If you love a yarn it needs your support!! So let's get ahead of this trend and shift it in our favor!!! I am going to start with a special and a KAL with future delivery times so I am caught up by the time it comes to get these out the door.

Support Targhee Worsted Special!!! will run for the next two weeks starting with the arrival of this newsletter. Details are below.

At the moment a 616 yd/ 8.9oz sells for \$40.00 which considering the quality and the yardage is a good buy. I am sending you a coupon code that is good for **30% off which**

brings it to 28.00 a skein. Right in time for sweater planning. For the KAL aspect of this adventure I want to focus on the yarn and fiber content itself and with knitting support and community. I am collecting some patterns from designers I love and of course I would love to hear yours. I HIGHLY recommend ordering these in shaded solids. Of course you can order whatever colorways make you happy but please know that the Speckle colorways will not speckle they will watercolor.

Support Targhee Worsted orders will be set to ship mid to the end of August.
