## Animals Live at Peace – Coloring Page (Preschool)


Read Isaiah 11:6-9 in a Common English Bible. Then, draw a line between the pairs of animals mentioned in the passage.

The word on this page is "bracha" which is the Hebrew word for blessing. It's a word which we see throughout the Bible, but especially in Genesis, chapter 12.



# 9D

## My Flag of Peace – Craft

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Look at examples of flags for different countries. Then, design a flag for your own peaceable kingdom.



## MAKE A SCROLL

- Have the kids work together to make a large classroom scroll. Make a few copies of Reproducible 9e to help in the construction of your scroll.
- Before class, roll out a long sheet of banner paper. Banner paper usually comes in rolls that are 15 feet long and 30 inches tall. You can use the entire roll of banner paper for your scroll, but you may want to cut the sheet down to about 20 inches tall. This will allow the cardboard tubes you are using to extend beyond the edges of the scroll. Tape the banner paper to two cardboard tubes as seen on Reproducible 9e.
- Hold up a Bible.

**Say:** Today, Scripture is printed on paper and bound together in a book. Or, people may use a computer or their phones to read the Bible. But in ancient times, Scripture was written on scrolls. We will add to our scroll all this month as we learn “Scriptures to Live By.”

- Divide your scroll into five sections horizontally along the scroll. In the first section, you will add things for today’s session. In the second, you’ll add things related to Session 10, and so forth.
- Write the words of this month’s Bible verse in the first section of the scroll in large letters using markers: “You, LORD, are to be blessed! Teach me your statutes,” (Psalm 119:12, CEB).

## PREDATOR AND PREY

- Mark two lines on either side of the play area using masking tape.

**Say:** In the wild, some animals eat other animals. They are called predators.

**Ask:** What do we call animals who are eaten by others (*prey*)?

- Choose one kid to be the predator. Invite them to wear a blindfold or bandanna.
- Have other kids identify themselves as the following types of prey: goat, calf, or lamb. Have the kid who is the predator stand in the middle of the two lines.
- Ask all of the “prey” to sit behind one of the lines.
- When the “predator” calls out one type of prey, those kids who have identified as that kind of prey must try to sneak across to the other side of the play area. If they are tagged by the “predator,” they must sit out. Play until only one “prey” remains.
- Choose other “predators” as time allows.

**Say:** Today’s Bible passage talks about predators and prey. But you may be surprised what it says about them.


