


HUNGER IN MISSOURI

Drive to Feed Kids first launched in 2017 with a goal of building collaborative partnerships among non-profit organizations, farmers and agricultural businesses committed to addressing hunger in Missouri. Additionally, Drive to Feed Kids allows the agriculture community an opportunity to talk about their utilization of science and technology to responsibly produce food for our communities and world. Last year, through Drive to Feed Kids, more than 2 million meals, including 946,207 servings of ground pork, were donated to those local food programs.


