





Help Jesus and the disciples find the fish. Jesus told the disciples that they would now be fishers of people! There are two pairs of fish that are the same. Can you find them?



## Come with Me based on Mark 1:14-20

When Jesus was ready to do what God had planned for him, he realized he needed to teach other people to help him. As he walked on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he looked for people to invite to come with him.

Up ahead was a boat. He watched as Andrew and his brother Simon threw their large fishing net, into the sea. As it sank, fish swam into the net, so when the brothers pulled it into the boat, they caught the fish. They were pretty good fishermen.

When he got near them, Jesus said, "Come with me. You will not fish for fish, but you will fish for people."

Immediately, the brothers left their net and their boat and went with Jesus.

As the three men walked, they saw two more brothers, James and John, the sons of Zebedee. They were sitting in their boat, repairing their net. Sometimes a net caught on a rock at the bottom of the water, and it ripped a hole in the net. They were doing a good job. Jesus invited them to join him, too.

They left their father Zebedee and the other workers in the boat and went with Jesus.

These men—Simon, Andrew, James, and John—were the first disciples, or followers, of Jesus.
