Méo Légaré, a valiant knight of modern times

When Guillaume was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes, his



first thought was that his opportunities for the future were being eroded. But it was counting without his determination, his courage, and, yes, why not, a little help from **Fred** and camp Carowanis.

Today, as Méo Légaré, he has decided to prove that type 1 diabetes is not and must NEVER be a hindrance to what can be accomplished. So he decided to take on a major challenge : **to walk the 106km from camp Carowanis to Fred's office in less than 24 hours, while raising funds**

to help other young people overcome their diabetes.

Quite a journey.

After an adequate preparation at the Mont des Morios, he started the adventure, on September 26th. At 4:22 a.m., several blisters on his feet, a few hypoglycemia carefully managed on the way, he arrived, exhausted but happy. **He raised \$4,570 out of a goal of \$3,000.**

Nothing is impossible, even when you have diabetes.

We consulted with the medical staff of the BETTER project and here is the advice we received.



Influenza vaccination for diabetic children

Diabetic children are generally not more at risk of contracting the flu virus, but they are at risk of an additional complication: diabetic ketoacidosis. That's why influenza vaccination is recommended for children 6 month of age and older living with type 1 diabetes.

Fortunately, the vaccine is covered by the RAMQ for diabetic children and their relatives living under the same roof.

In fact, the Quebec BETTER registry for people living with type 1 diabetes aims to provide more complete coverage of new technologies and therapies.
