

Election 2020 - Voting & Dialogue Resources Recommended by Presenters

iVoteCatholic (<https://ivotecatholic.org/>) is a collaborative initiative that was developed by the Office for Respect Life Ministries, Catholic Social Action, and the Office for Divine Worship within the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. It focuses on forming a Catholic conscience through the lens of the seven pillars of Catholic Social Teaching in a seven week approach leading up to the election in November. iVoteCatholic provides resources that meet the needs of both the parish and individuals in the process of discernment, prayer, and a universal call to holiness and compassion. These resources are adapted for every age and include prayers, catechetical plans, liturgical preparations, and homily helps.

We will be facilitating Civilize-It events both in parishes and online leading up to the election to encourage peaceful discussion and engagement on difficult and often controversial topics within our nation.)

It includes articles, videos, and a weekly podcast that focus on a comprehensive ethic of life through the lens of personal stories and experiences. The Podcast can be found on any major platform and the personal stories make it very engaging.

Awaken Catholic: The Catholic Vote (<https://www.awakencatholic.org/election>) An 8-part mini-series navigating some of the most challenging topics we face in 2020, what the Catholic Church has to say about them, and comparing the Church's teachings up to the Democrat and Republican party platforms. Topics include: Catholic Social Teaching, Marriage and the Family, Religious Freedom, Immigration, Racism, Socialism, the Environment, and Abortion.
