CONSENT FOR TREATMENT (for parents of those 17 and younger) By signing the 2020 Madagascar Registration Form I, hereby give permission for my child to participate in this Rocky Mountain Synod Sponsored Trip. I authorize the designated adult representatives who are acting in a leadership role to consent to and authorize the administration and performance of all treatments that may be considered advisable or necessary in the judgment of attending physicians, in the event that the participant should be admitted to any hospital, or be in need of any medical treatment. This authorization shall continue for such a time as the participant is involved in pre-trip meetings, the trip, or travel to and from Madagascar. I take full responsibility for all charges and fees related to treatment.

I understand that the care and safety of the participant will be primary in this event and that all attempts will be made to contact parents/guardians if an emergency or accident should happen.

2020 MADAGASCAR TRIP

Walk with your siblings in Christ living in the country of Madagascar and help your siblings in Christ in the Rocky Mountain Synod to walk with our companion synods and especially the Betela Seminary on the other side of the planet. The Rocky Mountain Synod (RMS) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is preparing for a trip to Madagascar during the summer of 2020. This is a 16-day trip taking twenty representatives (ambassadors) on an “accompaniment” experience.

This is not a sightseeing trip. This is not a service trip. Those going on the trip are ambassadors representing Christ, the RMS, congregations, campus ministries and communities of the RMS. We will first spend time in the capital city of Antananarivo for orientation to the country and the Lutheran church. Then, we will spend several important days with students, their families, faculty and staff at Betela Lutheran Seminary. **It is a particular goal of the RMS to grow in relationship with these future church leaders and pastors.** Our delegation will then be divided and sent to the four companion synods of the RMS before returning together to the United States.

Upon returning the group will be invited in a number of ways to tell the stories of the people, and in particular the seminarians of the Lutheran church in Madagascar.

Each participant on the trip will need to compile a **Support Team** that will send, support, and welcome back the ambassador. This team should be made up of people from one’s home congregation or campus ministry as well as surrounding congregations and other ministries of the RMS. For example, the team for a young adult might be made up of members of conference congregations plus someone from the local campus ministry and a member of the RMS Student Council. The team will help the individual in finding funding as well as praying for and helping the ambassador discern how to share what they have experienced once they have returned from the trip.

Transportation and accommodations may at times be less than what is familiar in the United States. There are risks due to limited medical response and treatment in addition to greater exposure to disease and other physical challenges. Political infrastructure has also been fragile in Madagascar for a number of years. Travelers should be physically fit, mentally ready for the rigors of international travel, and socially open to new and different experiences, people, and food.

Though the trip comes with some risks, being exposed to the greater body of Christ as it reaches around the globe is a powerful and life-giving/life-changing experience. To be considered for the trip, please fully complete the attached application. **The ambassador form and the Support Team form must be returned to the synod offices or emailed to pastor@lcmcsu.org by October, 31, 2019 with a \$100 deposit.** The deposit will be returned to those who are not selected. An additional a \$400 fee will be required in November from those who are selected.

Selection will be based on the goals of the trip while working to be as diverse as possible. Consider the established goals of the trip as you apply. They are printed on the second page of this cover letter. All participants must also agree to the “Terms of Participation.” Medical examination, medications, and shots in preparation for international travel will be an additional financial responsibility of participants.

Recognize that the trip is estimated to cost \$5000. Dates for the trip are tentatively set for May 26 to June 10, 2020 but those who apply should be somewhat flexible if the dates should shift. Applicants may also be contacted for more information if needed for the group selection process. **Applying for this trip should come with much discernment and conversation with your family, faith community, greater Christian community, and God.**
