Hunter, the first meeting of the

Friedman Memorial Group") was in
April, 1999 in Atlanta, GA. Since then

often in the Washington D.C. area, to
continue study of Bowen theory,
Friedman's thinking, and their
applications to congregational
leadership, as well as theological
connections.
