- · Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.




# Save The Date RMSWO Fall Gathering



I just finished reading this amazing book, Wilma Mankiller, How One Woman United the Cherokee Nation and Helped Change the Face of America. She is a bold and spiritual woman and she is described in this quote from the book on page 207:

Wilma Mankiller has brought together wise voices in a conversation about the things for which we long the most: Community, a sense of belonging in the universal scheme of things, support from kin and friends, feeling valued as we are. Balance, between people and nature, women and men, youth and age, people of different skills and colors, past and present and future. Peaceful ways of resolving differences, sitting in a circle, listening and talking, a consensus that is more important than the time it takes. Being of good mind, a positive outlook that energizes positive words and actions. Circle as paradigm, a full range of human qualities in each of us, equal value of different tasks, reciprocity, a way of thinking that goes beyond either/or and hierarchy. Spirituality, the mystery in all living things, the greatest and smallest, and therefore, the origin of balance, a good mind, peace, community.

"One of the advantages of being born an indigenous person is in knowing that no matter what happens in your life, someone will always be there for you and you'll be there for that person. It's a reciprocal relationship. No matter where in the world you go, someone will be around to remind you: You belong."

# **Leadership Event:**

On February 17 and 18 I attended via Zoom the Leadership Event: Living Faithfully presented by Women of the ELCA. If you were not able to attend, you still can view the event. It will be available on the Women of the ELCA website. Rev. Mary Finkles lead the opening from 1 Peter 4:7-11. She compared us to Acorns. An acorn is a seed that has the past, present and future of a tree through God. She shared, "You are not lacking in any spiritual gifts. You are like the acorn. Everything is present for God to work. Be Bold. Be generous so all can participate." When Pastor CeCe Mills presented the bible study from Jeremiah 29:4-11 where she focused us on the fact that 'God Knew.' 'God prepares us to meet what is coming. Can you answer these questions? 1. How can you set aside time to set God's provisions? 2. How can you step back in your now to see where

God is near? 3. How can you imagine your trajectory for your now? 4. How can you bask in God's plan for you now, before you see it? **God knew!** God is an active God! Bask in the now! God's got you! Make it a habit to pause, to breathe!'

# **Not Obsolete**

I'm roughly of the same vintage as the Skagit River Bridge, north of Seattle, which collapsed a few years ago after a truck's load of drilling equipment bumped the bridge's steel framework. The bridge was described as "functionally obsolete." News reports at the time of the collapse reported that nearly 85,000 additional US bridges were also "functionally obsolete," according to the Federal Highway Administration.

Like a lot of those 85,000 bridges, some of us could probably use a bit of maintenance and repair. We're walking around with some visible (and invisible) signs of damage and aging.

Thankfully, unlike aging bridges, Christians don't become functionally obsolete as we age. Granted, some of us don't age gracefully; others of us are stuck in outmoded ministry models, fighting change at every turn, but we always remain adequate for our task of being disciples. Whatever

our age, whatever our abilities, wherever we find ourselves, we are more than adequately equipped to be disciples of Christ. "Are you still breathing?" asks Sister Joan Chittister. "Then you've still got work to do in the name of Christ."

# How To Sign Up For The RMS e-Connection by e-mail

We encourage every woman in the Rocky Mountain Synod to sign up to receive the weekly Synod Newsletter called e-Connection. It is sent out every Wednesday to your e-mail address, and it contains articles and pictures about many things in our lives together as Lutherans living in the states that make up the Rocky Mountain Synod.

Once a quarter, e-Connection will have an article about the current issue of our *Views from the Rockies*—the newsletter of the RMS Women's Organization. You will be directed to the Synod website, which is where *Views* issues will be available. You may read them online, and also print a copy for your personal use. Ask your church office to print the *Views* for you if you do not have access to the website.

Please sign up as follows:

1. On your computer, go to the Rocky Mountain Synod website by putting this URL into your browser: https://www.rmselca.org/faithforma-

- tion/Rocky Mountain Synodical Womens Organization
- 2. On the home page, scroll down to the bottom, and in the middle of the page you will see: Subscribe to e-mail Newsletter. Below that line is a yellow rectangle that says e-mail List. Simply click on the yellow rectangle! This takes you to a page that asks for your e-mail Address, your first & last name, and to check a box stating if you are a Pastor, Associate in Ministry, Diaconal Minister, or Deaconess. Below this you should check the box that states: "I wish to receive e-Connection each week."
- 3. Finally, click on the bottom bar that says "Sign Up." That's it! Remember, this is a free subscription to the synod e-mail weekly newsletter. You will receive notice of new issues of our *Views from the Rockies* newsletters from the synod's e-Connection e-mail.
