*From the first recorded celebration meal in 1621 to the time Thanksgiving became a national holiday in the midst of the Civil War and to today, Thanksgiving has symbolized people of different backgrounds, ideologies, religions, races, and ethnicities coming together to give thanks. In a proclamation for the first Thanksgiving, President Lincoln encouraged all Americans to ask God to “commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife [and to] heal the wounds of the nation.” These words are just as applicable today as many among us have experienced such suffering and as we strive to bring healing to our community and nation through the acknowledgement of the ways we are all interconnected.*
