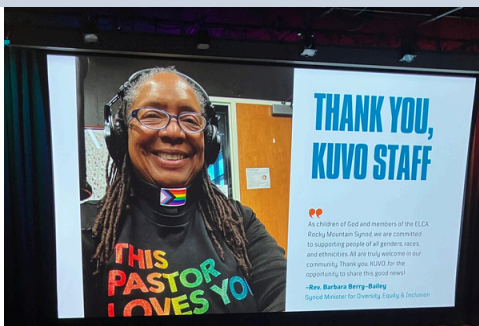
The Rocky Mountain Synod is a community of 150 congregations across Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, New Mexico, and El Paso—gathered in Christ for the sake of the world. “Synod” literally means “on the way together”—on the way of Jesus together. **With gratitude, we celebrate how your mission support strengthened our shared ministry in 2025 as we Relate + Connect + Support + Equip one another to be Christ’s hands and feet in every community.**

In 2025, we gathered for Synod Assembly in Albuquerque, New Mexico (May 22–24, 2025) under the theme “Dios está aquí. God is Here.”—worshiping, voting, learning, and listening for where the Spirit is leading next.

In her report to the 2025 Synod Assembly, Bishop Meghan Johnston Aelabouni reflected on Exodus 3—God meeting Moses on the way, calling him to “remove the sandals” and recognize holy ground. **That same holy ground exists across our synod: in congregations, in grief and celebration, in advocacy and accompaniment, and in the everyday work of living out our faith and welcoming neighbors—especially those who are vulnerable and afraid.**

In 2025, the Rocky Mountain Synod advanced one memorial and three resolutions:

- **Memorial (to the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly):** Advocacy for human rights, justice, and peace for Palestinians and Israelis, including policy actions and prayerful accompaniment.
- **Resolutions (synod-wide commitments):**
 - **Honoring Indigenous Peoples Through Faith, Respect and Action**
 - **Renewing Our Welcome:** Strengthening Our Reconciling in Christ Commitment
 - **Campus Ministry:** Affirming campus ministry as vital to young adult faith formation and leadership

Rocky Mountain Synod Ministers

Bishop Meghan Johnston Aelabouni, the fourth bishop of the Rocky Mountain Synod, elected in 2024, now shepherds our collective ministry with heart, vision, and a deep commitment to walking alongside leaders and congregations in every context. In 2025, the Rocky Mountain Synod officially completed its synod staff team of ten—a roster of leaders called, appointed, and ready to serve congregations and ministries across Wyoming, Utah, New Mexico, Colorado and El Paso. With this gifted team of rostered ministers and lay leaders now fully in place, the Rocky Mountain Synod is well-positioned to:

- Strengthen congregational life by resourcing transitions, transition teams, and intentional ministry planning.
- Equip leaders, both lay and rostered, for faithful ministry in evolving contexts.
- Advance justice and advocacy and nurture generosity and stewardship, so congregations can share in collective mission support and gospel work.
- Tell our story together, aligning communication and amplifying what Christ is up to in our midst across synod ministries.
