Tomatoes	
<u>Variety</u>	<u>Description</u>
<i>What's the difference between "indeterminate" and "determinate" tomatoes?</i>	<p>Determinate tomatoes, or "bush" tomatoes, are varieties that grow to a compact height (generally 3 - 4'). Determinates growth slows as the fruit sets. Tomatoes from the plant ripen at approximately the same time (usually over a few weeks). They require a limited amount of staking for support and are perfectly suited for container planting.</p> <p>Indeterminate tomatoes will grow and produce fruit until killed by frost. They can reach heights of up to 12 feet although 6 feet is normal. Indeterminate plants will bloom, set new fruit, and ripen fruit all at the same time providing fresh tomatoes throughout the season. They require staking for support.</p>
Orange Wellington 	<p>Beautiful Orange color that Bursts with flavor</p> <p>Here's a tomato you'll want to have with dinner, lunch or as an occasional snack. Tipping the scales at 12 oz., this smooth, orange heavyweight is plump with firm, dense, meaty, nearly seedless flesh. Blossoms and fruit develop progressively; the harvest lasts several months. Indeterminate. 75 days</p>

<p>Bush Beefsteak</p> 	<p>A great choice for containers or small gardens. A wonderful, compact, and prolific plant that grows to 3 feet and yields huge amounts of 8-10 oz. beefsteak tomatoes, perfect for sandwiches! Determinate. 68 days</p>
<p>Black Krim</p> 	<p>An heirloom delight! Medium-sized, very dark maroon beefsteak tomatoes, with wonderfully rich flavor. Originated in Crimea, a peninsula in the Black Sea with perfect "tomato summers". Extremely tasty. Indeterminate. 80 days</p>
<p>Bodacious</p> 	<p>A Burpee Superstar! These large, round, vibrant, pure-red 10–12 oz. fruits entice with heirloom aromatics and tangy tomato sweetness. Compact 5–6' vines yield 8–10 spectacular fruits a week and a bold, audacious 40–50 per season, per plant. 'Bodacious' tomatoes grow in large clusters—easy to pick and no cracking. Excellent disease resistance. Indeterminate. 80 days</p>
<p>Big Mama</p> 	<p>Enormous size and flavor. These Romas are plum-shaped, incredibly meaty, and enormous - up to 5" long and 3" across. Skin peels away easily after par-boiling, which means less fuss, less mess and more delicious, thick, creamy sauce! Indeterminate. 80 days</p>

<p>Honeycomb</p> 	<p>Petite golden-orange tomatoes with a taste of honey! Honeycomb's 6-7' vines are garlanded with 12-15" trusses that cascade into clusters of sweet petite 1/2 oz. golden-orange tomatoes rich in flavor. Indeterminate. 75 days.</p>
<p>Black Pearl</p> 	<p>Two distinct flavors in one cherry! Black Pearl has tomato-deep, and sweet flavors at the same time. Produces an abundance of 1 1/2" purplish black fruits until fall. Enjoy right off the vine and be sure to put a big bowlful in the refrigerator for a special treat. Once chilled, Black Pearl has a unique, extra sweet, Concord grape flavor. Indeterminate. 65 days.</p>
