Type	Proposition	WECA Recommends	Description
CISS	14	No	Authorizes \$5.5 billion in general obligation bonds for state stem cell research institute
CICA	15	No	Requires commercial and industrial properties to be taxed based on market value and dedicates revenue
LRCA	16	No	Repeals Proposition 209 (1996), which says that the state cannot discriminate or grant preferential treatment based on race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in public employment, education, or contracting
LRCA	17	No	Restores the right to vote to people convicted of felonies who are on parole. Under existing law, felons who have completed their parole can vote
LRCA	18	No	Allows 17-year-olds who will be 18 at the time of the next general election to vote in primaries and special elections
LRCA	19	No	Changes tax assessment transfers and inheritance rules
CISS	20	Yes	Makes changes to policies related to criminal sentencing charges, prison release, and DNA collection
CISS	21	No	Expands local governments' power to use rent control
CISS	22	Yes	Considers app-based drivers to be independent contractors and enacts several labor policies related to app-based companies
CISS	23	No	Requires physician on-site at dialysis clinics and consent from the state for a clinic to close
CISS	24	No	Expands the provisions of the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) and creates the California Privacy Protection Agency to implement and enforce the CCPA
VR	25	No	Replaces cash bail with risk assessments for suspects awaiting trial
