 Candlelighting - after 8:02 PM  
 Second Seder

### Second Day of Pesach, Sunday, April 1<sup>st</sup>:

Shacharit - 9:00 AM  
 Mincha/Maariv - 7:10 PM  
 Yom Tov Ends - 8:03 PM

### Chol HaMoed Pesach, Monday - Thursday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> - April 5<sup>th</sup>:

Shacharit - 7:00 AM  
 Mincha/Maariv - 7:10 PM

### Sixth Day of Pesach, Thursday Evening, April 5<sup>th</sup>:

Don't forget Eruv Tavshilin (see page 2)  
 Mincha/Maariv - 7:00 PM  
 Candlelighting - 7:07 PM

### Seventh Day of Pesach, Friday, April 6<sup>th</sup>:

Shacharit - 9:00 AM  
 Mincha/Maariv - 7:00 PM  
 Candlelighting - before 7:08 PM

### Eighth Day of Pesach, Saturday, April 7<sup>th</sup>:

Shacharit - 9:00 AM  
 Yizkor - 11:00 AM  
 Pesach ends - 8:09 PM  
 Wait till after 9:15 PM to eat chametz

### FAST OF THE FIRST BORN

Passover Eve is a traditional Fast for the First Born in recognition of the Jewish firstborns being spared the plague in Egypt. By attending/participating in a Siyum, the completion of a Tractate of Talmud on Friday morning, March 30, the first born are exempt from fasting. Rabbi Langer will conduct the Siyum. The Service starts at 7:00 AM.
