April 9: CREATIVE MEMORIES - SCRAPMAKING: Preserving memories in a fun, creative way.

**Instructor:** *Dyna Curtis* has a Master's Degree in teaching Special Education. She has been Scrapbooking with a few groups for at least ten years. She has also been quilting and card making for many years.

April 23: BEGINNING QUILLING: Students will learn basic quilling.

**Instructor:** *Elaine Dow* is a University of Maine graduate with a BS in Microbiology. She worked in that field in other states. Elaine has done quilling and is willing to teach it – it is not easy of locate an instructor for this particular art form. She will be assisted by **Linda Stevens**.

April 30: TISSUE/KITE PAPER STAR MAKING: Ruth will show you how to make beautiful, colorful stars that you can exhibit on your windows. You can make endless color combinations or just use one color. They make lovely additions as Christmas decorations, and can also be left on the windows year-round. The will help to prevent birds from flying into the windows, getting hurt or even dying. This is especially helpful if you like to feed the birds. She first learned how to make the stars many, many years ago, when she and her husband rented a room in their house to a Waldorf school teacher. She has been making them ever since that time. Similar to the Western card game, rummy, Mah Jongg is a game of skill, strategy, and calculation and involves a degree of chance. The game is played with a set of 152 tiles based on Chinese characters and symbols, although some regional variations use a different number of tiles. In most variations, each player begins by receiving 13 tiles. In turn, players draw and discard tiles until they complete a legal hand using the 14th drawn tile to form four groups (melds) and a pair (head).

**Instructor:** Nina Mocniak Doak, a member of the National Mah Jongg League, is an experienced Mah Jongg player. She credits her knowledge of the game to Janice Woychik, a local Mah Jongg instructor, and Elaine Sandberg, the author of "A Beginner's Guide to American Mah Jongg." For the last 10 years, Nina has offered private instructions.

PHIPPEN ON PHIPPEN: WORKS IN PROGRESS April 5, 12, 19, & 26 10:30 am-12:30 pm This course offers students a unique opportunity to accompany accomplished Maine author (and 20-year veteran teacher of Downeast Senior College Literature and Film courses) Sanford Phippen through the creative process as he retires from his professorial career and devotes himself to finishing three new books: a novel (a sequel to *Kitchen Boy*) about his years teaching high school in Syracuse, NY; a biography of a great Maine character; and a book of essays and reviews, many of which first appeared in the *Puckerbrush Review*, 1979-2015. Essentially a story-teller as a teacher, Phippen will be reading from and discussing selections from the three books and even listening to the opinions of his students. One might ask about the nuts and bolts: how the creative process is differently engaged in the later stages of completing a professional manuscript from the earlier stages. This could be Phippen's most exciting course yet! Instructor: Sanford Phippen, an author with deep Maine roots, grew up in Downeast Maine. He is a graduate of the University of Maine, where he later became an Assistant Professor of English, and received his graduate degree from Syracuse University. Phippen taught full-time for 53 1/2 years, also publishing 19 books, working on 40-some books by others, and producing 30-son e films and TV shows. He has received the Distinguished Teaching Award from Bowdoin College, the Stillwater Award for Excellence from the University of Maine, and his book Kitchen Boy was chosen as one of the 100 "Distinguished Books That Reveal the History of the State and the Life of its People" by the Baxter Bibliophile Society and the Maine Historical Society for their book and exhibit called The Mirror of Maine in 2000.
