

Being Prepared

Wear: We'll be learning in our great Nevada outdoors all day, so wear comfy outdoor layers, sunscreen, and a hat or visor for the sun. You may want water shoes for our water time. Be ready to go from cool to hot and back again.

Bring: Water in refillable water bottle. We try to be "green" and discourage using bottled water. Bring your sack lunch, extra sunscreen, an extra layer to wear, and a pen or pencil, all ideally in a little daypack. There are plenty of folding chairs at the River School Farm, but you may bring your own lawn chair for comfort.

Driving Directions: the River School Farm at 7777 White Fir Street in west Reno; just west of Mayberry Park on West Fourth Street, turn left on Woodland Avenue and left on White Fir Street. Follow White Fir Street to the end, park on the street, and walk into the farm.
