- **Earl W. Kintner Award for Distinguished Service**

Presented as a lifetime contribution award to an FBA member who has displayed long-term outstanding achievement, distinguished leadership, and participation in the activities of the association's chapters, sections, and divisions throughout the nation over a career of service.

- **Hon. Sarah T. Hughes Civil Rights Award**

Presented to an FBA member who promotes the advancement of civil and human rights, and who exemplifies devoted service and leadership in the cause of equality.

- **Peter J. Mazza Outstanding Federal Lawyer Award**

Presented to an FBA member who has dedicated a significant portion of their career to federal service with high standards of professional achievement and outstanding performance.

- **Elaine R. "Boots" Fisher Award**

Presented to an FBA member whose actions have enhanced, promoted and encouraged community, charitable and/or public service. A cash contribution in the amount of \$1,000 will be made in the recipient's name to a charity selected by the recipient.

- **The Robyn J. Spalter Outstanding Achievement Award**

Presented to a member of the FBA who joined as a "younger attorney" and who has (or has had) sustained, general accomplishment over a three-year period of service in the individual chapter, section, or division through which leadership was provided; or who has a specific accomplishment that resulted in a significant contribution reflecting exceptional leadership and activity management in the understanding and development of federal law, community or public service, the administration of justice, and/or the welfare of federal attorneys.

- **Younger Federal Lawyer Award**

Presented to any "younger" civilian or military attorney who is employed by the U.S. government and who has demonstrated significant professional achievements benefitting federal public law and the legal profession and/or who has made substantial contributions to their community.
