Dear siblings in Christ,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Easter season is here, Spring is slowly unfolding, and vaccines are now available to everybody 16 and older in Wisconsin! We are encouraged to hear that many of you are now fully or partially vaccinated. COVID rates are decreasing, vaccination rates are increasing, Amma Diane has been vaccinated, and the weather is getting warmer. We're finalizing details to resume in-person activities for those who are ready to do so. Being aware that some of us are at different stages of vaccination and that some are not able to get vaccinated for the time being, we are using guidelines that err on the side of safer options:

We will resume an in-person Worship option Sundays at 10AM starting Sunday, May 16.

- Please wear a mask. Masks will be required when in the building.
- If you have any symptoms of illness, please remain home.
- Please follow signs and directions of ushers and other leaders when entering and exiting. All should enter from State Street (the 8th Street and kitchen doors will remain locked.)
- We ask that you maintain 6+ foot distance from those you don't live with.
- Please don't gather anywhere inside the building with people outside your household.
- We will have doors and windows open for air exchange—dress as you need to for comfort.
- Specific pews will be blocked to help households sit safely distanced.
- Initially, the lower level of the building will be blocked off during Sunday Worship.
- Initially, the handicap-accessible restroom outside the sanctuary will be the only restroom available.
- Communion (bread only) will be provided for those who would like it. Like the spiritual communion we have been participating in for the past year, this is sacramentally appropriate any time receiving bread and/or wine is not a possibility for any reason. (The bread and wine are the outward and visible signs of the inward and spiritual grace in the communion sacrament.)
- Singing remains a less safe activity. For now, our in-person Worship option will not include music. If positive trends continue, we hope to resume music and even singing sometime in the Fall.
- We ask that you refrain from touching, hugging, shaking hands, etc. and instead greet each other and share your love through verbal or other contact-less expressions.

We will continue to offer an online Worship option Sundays at 10AM on Facebook and YouTube.

- These will maintain the look and feel of the online services we have been offering during the pandemic.
- These videos will continue to include music and singing, as well as all the words/lyrics on-screen.
- If you need a DVD of any of our services, please contact Amma Diane.

We will not resume Sunday Fellowship time in the building until further notice.

- The lower level will remain closed off on Sundays.
- We encourage you to continue to seek fellowship with each other in ways that are safe for all involved.

Sunday Bible Study will remain on Zoom (internet & phone) until further notice.

- We'll bump the time slightly earlier (8:30-9:30AM) so participants who want to can get to church by 10AM.
- At some point we'll switch to hybrid, adding an in-person option and continuing to offer via Zoom.

Our weekly services Wednesdays at 4PM & Fridays at 7AM will continue to be via Zoom/phone.

- At some point we'll switch to hybrid, adding an in-person option and continuing to offer via Zoom.

Other church groups may choose to begin gathering in-person starting in June.

- Participants of Book Group, Women's/Men's Fellowship Groups, Crafting Group, etc. should discuss among themselves when they are comfortable to resume an in-person meeting option and let Amma Diane know.
- Groups may gather in the lower level of the building or other locations.
- Please wear a mask. Masks will be required when in the building.
- Those groups that resume meeting in person should continue to offer the option to connect via Zoom for those who aren't yet ready to return to in-person activities.
- Each group should let Amma Diane know their plans so we can include the correct information in our communication.

Our Annual Meeting is scheduled following Worship on Sunday, June 27.

- The meeting will take place in the Sanctuary with the same guidelines as in-person Worship.
- There will not be food/snacks, so we will try to keep the meeting brief.
- We will elect Wardens/Vestry (church council), Diocesan Convention delegates/alternates, and church Endowment Trustees. Information and nomination forms will be available in church starting May 16. Advance nominations should be returned by June 13 (nominations are permitted from the floor.)
- 2020 Annual Reports were delivered to homes in February. If you need a copy, contact Amma Diane.

For all the above, we are not requiring or checking to see if people are vaccinated.

- Like wearing masks and maintaining physical distance over the past year, getting vaccinated can be a major way we show love for our neighbors. We highly encourage everybody who can do so get vaccinated as soon as possible. This helps prevent further community spread and mutations that create stronger viruses. We realize that for various reasons, some are unable/unwilling to get vaccinated—the rest of us being vaccinated helps protect them.
- Vaccines are available now for anybody age 16 or over, and there is no charge. Contact your regular health provider, the Manitowoc County Health Department, or most local pharmacies to arrange for your vaccination. If you need help, please contact Amma Diane.

This is our plan, God willing. As conditions improve, we'll continue to resume as much normalcy as possible. We'll also keep the best of what we've learned and implemented the past 13 months to strengthen our ministry/mission.

We miss you. We love you. We hold you in prayer. We look forward to seeing you soon!
