### Becoming Beloved Community series 7/12 through 8/16

The Beloved Community is the body within which all people can grow to love God and love the image of God that we find in our neighbors, in ourselves, and in creation. It provides a positive, theologically, and biblically based ideal that orients the work of racial healing, reconciliation, and justice. It is the end toward which the Jesus Movement points.

The Episcopal Church's Becoming Beloved Community vision frames a path for Episcopalians to address racial injustice and grow as a community of reconcilers, justice-makers, and healers who share a passion for the dream of God. Because this is the work of spiritual formation, and not simply completing a training or implementing a set of programs, individuals and congregations are encouraged to embrace the journey ahead as a long-term commitment.

**St James Episcopal Church will begin our Becoming Beloved Community journey with a six-week Worship series at 10AM on Sundays July 12 through August 16.** As the summer progresses, we'll have other opportunities to engage more deeply together.

## Vestry Notes—updated 7/10

- ◆ We are continuing to work through our insurance company and the restoration company at getting to the root cause(s) of where water has leaked into our building (notable the recent leaks in Rector's office). We do know that some building repair and maintenance work will be needed. We are in the processes of getting a variety of quotes for that work. More to come.
- ◆ Amma Diane will be taking vacation time July 22-29. She will be reachable by phone for any pastoral emergencies. We will not have Wednesday worship services on 7/22 & 7/29. Other activities will take place in the usual ways.
- ◆ **Manitowoc County Covid-19 total positive cases was at 147 as of July 10, up from 108 on July 3. Current active cases increased to 107.** Wisconsin cases continues to increase significantly. The Manitowoc County Health Department recommends limiting non-essential travel, including within the state. We can all do our part to continue to help limit the spread. Limiting interaction outside your household is still the safest option. When interacting in public settings, maintain physical distance and wear masks. If you have symptoms, get tested.
- ◆ As we prepare to return to in-person activities (hopefully in the near future), we'll need to stock up on supplies: disinfectant wipes, hand sanitizer, paper towel, reusable cloth masks, disposable masks, gloves, etc. If you would like to help by donating any of these supplies, please contact Amma Diane.

*Your St James Episcopal Church Vestry is having weekly executive session meetings in response to the pandemic, to check in with each other as leadership of the congregation and to respond as quickly as possible to changes due to COVID-19 that could affect St James and our congregation. The next regular public Vestry meeting will be in August (date TBD).*

## Meals on Wheels & Hope House Updates

St James members are scheduled to volunteer at Hope House, and deliver Meals on Wheels during the **week of August 2 – 8**. Both programs have revised their policies with the safety of volunteers in mind as they continue to help those in need while taking necessary precautions..

Hope House volunteers are needed to staff the 5 to 8 pm shift and to provide a meal for the residents on either August 3 or August 6. Everyone at Hope House wears masks in the common areas, and residents do not enter the volunteer office. If you care to provide a meal for the residents it can be dropped off at the door without entering the building. We share our Hope House week with members of Lakeshore United Methodist Church.

Meals on Wheels volunteers deliver meals to six senior living facilities. Volunteers wear masks and do not enter the Senior Center. Meals are delivered at the doorway of each building with limited contact with residents.

Both programs are again permitting volunteers over the age of 65. Please give Anne Schuette a call if you would like to volunteer and represent St James in August. Thanks!
