NEW! 12/9 message from the Episcopal Bishops of Wisconsin Regarding COVID guidance

Dear Friends in Christ,

While we are grateful to God for the progress we have made in keeping people safe from COVID infection, we are writing today to remind Episcopalians in the State of Wisconsin that the pandemic is not over. Indeed, we now know that the most recently detected variant, Omicron, has been detected in our state. The data is still being collected, but it seems clear that this variant is significantly more transmissible than Delta and that current vaccines and boosters do not prevent transmission in all cases. We do know that vaccinations and boosters still provide important protection against developing the most serious illness and hospitalization.

This is a moment to ask all of our congregations to continue to take the pandemic with due seriousness and care. Let us recommit ourselves to the responsible, careful practices we have learned over the past months. In order to keep one another as safe as possible, we strongly encourage masking and social distancing when we gather. We urge every eligible member of the church to be fully vaccinated and to receive appropriate booster shots. We commend the continuation of virtual options for worship and other meetings. And we commend the guidelines adopted in most of our churches regarding masking, social distancing, and the reception of Holy Communion.

These are challenging times for us all, but we are members of the Body of Christ who is the light of the world. In these Advent days leading to the Christmas Feast, let us renew our trust in the God who is with us in every circumstance, in every challenge or time of uncertainty or fear. Let us commit ourselves to be bearers of God's light and love to one another and to the world.

Advent Reflections from the Wardens (Chris Eggert-Rosenthal & Mary Green)

As Advent begins, we are reflecting on the many things our congregation has continued, started, or strengthened in the past few months of this ongoing pandemic. We would like to share with you some of our thoughts and appreciations about Life at St James:

1. We just completed our adopt-a-family mission project, providing requested gifts for family members. This annual program is organized by the Salvation Army and always brings joy to the givers as well as the recipients. We have been doing this for several years (following a decade of doing this for our Homework Club families). We are grateful to Karleen Cole for coordinating.
2. Since early 2020, we make deliveries to every household a few times a year, including info and resources, as well as fun things like St James-branded items and treats. On December 11 we'll gather to bake together, and on December 12 we'll assemble and make our second annual distribution of sweet treats and information to all St James households. The project will be one of our first large group activities besides in-person Worship. We are anticipating a great fellowship opportunity.
3. The Reverse Advent Calendar is another way we reach out to serve our community and share our resources with others. See the back page of St James Weekly.
4. Thank you to Eleanor Agnew for creating a Thankful Tree on our vestibule bulletin board. All are encouraged to add leaves to express their gratitude. This is another way we can connect to each other. Watch for another bulletin board update for Christmas season.
5. In the spirit of Community, we have resumed posting faith/prayer memes several times per week on our Facebook page. These are offered to provide encouragement, spark prayer, and nurture spiritual growth. These are sharable and have been well received by both St James members and friends. This helps extend our reach to the Facebook community who might not otherwise be aware of St James.
6. We are grateful to Donna Franz who faithfully sends cards and notes to those celebrating milestones, to Eleanor Agnew who is now working with our Scrip program, and to Liz Foster who coordinates our calling tree.
7. Barb Cook (who grew up in St James) and her husband John moved back to Manitowoc and became members of St James last year during COVID. Barb is now playing piano some weeks as part of our music ministry, and we are grateful for her gifts.
8. Dave Haefke, Murray Sim, Steve Thuss, and other volunteers help with repairs and maintenance to keep our building comfortable and safe. Plaster repair continues and we look forward to the upcoming completion of this restoration project. (Murray also works as our Sexton to keep the building clean.)
9. We have resumed Fellowship Hour after Sunday Worship, building community with conversation. We look forward to having refreshments, snacks, and treats as soon as it is safe and reasonable to do. In the meantime, we continue safe masking/distancing practices to keep all of us safe regardless of our vaccination status.
10. Another way that we connect is through the monthly second Saturday fellowship time. This will continue to be

a hybrid offering (in-person and via Zoom) for those who cannot or do not wish to participate in person. This will also enable us to gather during inclement weather.

11. The St James book club will be meeting via Zoom for the near future and will continue to welcome everyone. You need not have read the book to participate. Our group represents a variety of backgrounds and we have many opportunities to see books in various lights. This brings depth to the discussions, as well as an ability to grow.
12. Our weekly Bible Study again provides an opportunity to share ideas and learn from each other. We explore different translations of Scripture to provide greater understanding of words written so long ago. This weekly class is both in-person and Zoom to provide access to all.
13. Our Wednesday mid-week Worship and Friday Morning Prayer continue to be offered by Zoom.
14. Looking ahead, to continue our community outreach, we will be setting up a Little Free Library (LFL) at St James this Spring. The LFL movement is widespread, including many throughout Manitowoc.
15. Next Spring we also look forward to creating our own labyrinth in our parking lot. This meditative tool is another way of bringing St James into the community. Thanks to Pat Hanson for beautifully resurfacing and striping our parking lot this fall.
16. We will be relocating our church mailbox from the 8th St steps to our State St doors to provide safer drops for our mail carriers and members drop off items.
17. One of our major community (and wider) outreach tools has been the expansion of our online presence. We are grateful to Amma Diane, Tony Karl, Glenn Davidowich, Pat Hanson, Fr Jerry Molitor, and Chris Couris for helping provide our pre-recorded Worship services from March 2020 through October 2021. Pat Hanson was invaluable in setting up our cameras and everything else needed for livestreaming, which we started this October. We are grateful to our livestreaming Media Team of Pat Hanson, Tony Karl, and Steve Phillips who will produce and operate things moving forward. All of these people have contributed to making our online presence a huge success. Our media production values have been highly complimented and have helped us stay connected inside our congregation, around our community, and with people from other cities, states, and even countries.
