St James Episcopal Church is the oldest continually operating congregation of any type in Manitowoc County. Our origins trace to missionary pastors starting in 1841. We organized formally as a congregation in 1848, the year Wisconsin gained statehood.

Since 1848, St James has been served by 41 pastors, including The Rev Diane M Murray (Amma Diane) who will be retiring as our Rector on 12/31/2022 after 13.5 years. Only two pastors in our 181-year history served our congregation for longer durations: William Harvey (27 years) and Franklin St Clair (23 years). We are grateful for the 13.5 years Amma Diane has served as our Rector, as well as the prior 1.5 years she ministered with us while she was a Deacon.

On Sunday, December 18, we will celebrate with a farewell party (Packers are off). Following 10AM Worship we'll all meet at the Harrigan Parkside Gathering Center 2 blocks away for a catered meal. We want everybody to have the opportunity to celebrate, so there will be no tickets/charge. We will need a head count soon, so please add your names on the sign-up sheet as soon as possible. Additional details will follow in December.

NEW! Vestry Notes

- The Vestry has formally notified Bishop Matt of our acceptance of the retirement of The Rev'd Diane M Murray as our Rector, effective 31 December 2022, with gratitude for her ministry with us since 2009. We are working with Diocesan Transition Officer, The Rev'd Meredyth Albright, to begin the first steps of the transition process. We'll include many updates about this process in the packets we'll distribute on December 11 along with the cookie swap project.
- As of 10/31/2022, our year-to-date income is \$97,764 on a YTD budget of \$94,161. Our YTD expenses are \$100,554 on a YTD budget of \$103,673. This results in a YTD <u>deficit</u> of \$2,790 (better than projected). Lower expenses are primarily because we have not yet started as many building projects as originally imagined. Thank you for your continued support of our mission and ministry! Complete financial reports are posted outside the office.
- Thank you to everybody who helped make our Thanksgiving celebration at St James a joyful event! It was our first Thanksgiving together since 2019.



Next St James/Painting Pathways event 12/8

Painting Pathways Clubhouse supports and empowers those with mental illness in Manitowoc County by building community and supporting recovery. PPC is one of our long -term ministry partners: several people from St James were instrumental in helping this non-profit form in Manitowoc; we've provided work opportunities; we supported the capital campaign for their new building; and we let them use our building during their construction.

In October we began a series of events to strengthen our relationships as individuals beyond our larger organizations. St James brought pot luck dishes to share. It was a wonderful evening—thanks to all who participated! On **Thursday, December 8 from 4-6PM we'll gather again at PPC** (1226 Washington St) to enjoy a meal and fellowship, including games with their members. Painting Pathways will provide the food, but a head count will help planning. There is a sign-up sheet in the church.
