Vestry Notes—updated 8/7

- ◆ We recently distributed reusable bags and other items featuring our St James logo in celebration of the Feast of James. If you would like more of any of these items for yourself or to give away, please contact Amma Diane or Chris Eggert-Rosenthal.
- ◆ Our Diocesan Faithful Innovations program will be finding new ways to move forward after a break due to the pandemic. Our Vestry team will begin a second phase in the near future, and share more info at that time.
- ◆ **Manitowoc County Covid-19 total positive cases was at 332 as of August 7, up from 294 on July 31. Current active cases increased to 201.** Wisconsin cases continues to increase significantly. The Manitowoc County Health Department recommends limiting non-essential travel, including within the state. We can all do our part to continue to help limit the spread. Limiting interaction outside your household is still the safest option. When interacting in public settings, maintain physical distance and wear masks. If you have symptoms, get tested.
- ◆ This year's Diocesan Convention will not be in-person, but will be virtual due to the pandemic. Information will begin to become available in August for delegates and Amma Diane will be contacting each delegate.
- ◆ We are continuing the processes of getting assessments and quotes for work on our building to help prevent future leaks. Some building repair and maintenance work will be needed. More information to come.
