Remembering Those Affected by Homelessness

Celebrant God, who calls us by our name, in whose image we are made... God, who does not pass us by, who hears the cries of the poor... God, who isn't impressed by our savings, properties, and pensions... God, who has given us unique talents, skills, and gifts to share:

People **Come in from the cold, make your home in our hearts.**

Celebrant Jesus of no fixed address, come into this house, your home. Take refuge and shelter with us here.

People **Your feet must be tired, your heart must be heavy. Sit down with us, Lord. Tell us your stories, open our eyes to you. Make your home in our hearts. AMEN!**

Celebrant Each day, thousands of individuals, youth, and families in the United States wake up without a place to call home. Over 550,000 Americans are homeless on a typical night. Affordable housing is at risk, and in many communities, non-existent. Youth under 20 are forced to live on the streets or shelters. Families are forced out of their homes, with limited to no resources to provide a roof for shelter. The Bible calls us to shelter the homeless and feed those who are hungry. Many Christians are making a difference through advocating for affordable housing, supporting shelters and transitional housing, and participating in social

service programs. In Worship today, we remember those affected by homelessness in our community and our world.

Reader 1 Those who are homeless can be seen in doorways, in bus stations, in parks, and on the roadside. They can be found in abandoned buildings, in shelters, and in parked cars. In the hustle and bustle of our lives we walk by them, for they are invisible to us.

People **O God, help us slow down our fast-paced lives and give us the strength to open our eyes to those who are homeless.**

Reader 2 They are the men, women, and children of all background who, due to unfortunate circumstances, are left without a place to live and food to nourish them.

People **O God, you call us to help them, as best we are able.**

Reader 1 They have stories rich in both joy and sadness to tell. They seem voiceless, because we are too involved in our own lives to take the time to listen.

People **O, God, please help us to find the courage to stop and listen to the stories of your people.**

Reader 2 Often they are lonesome, with very few people willing to care for them or to provide them with the warmth they deserve.

People **O God, help us to open our hearts to accept your people whom society has abandoned.**

Reader 1 They are your children. They are similar to us. They too have hopes, dreams, desires, and aspirations.

People **O God, help us open our minds so we may recognize all on the earth as your people.**

Reader 2 These are your people filled with your love and goodness—although often overlooked.

People **O God, open our minds to allow us to see the beauty in all of your people.**

Reader 1 They frighten us because we do not know their stories. They frighten us because deep down we know that we can easily become one of them.

People **O God, forgive us for our fears and help us to remember that your light shines through them just as brightly as it shines through any of your children.**

Reader 2 Let us offer our repentance as citizens and as the Body of Christ.

People **Reconciling God, we confess our sin and the sin of this world that form great divisions between the haves and the have nots; the housed and the homeless; the well fed and the hungry; the rich and the poor. For our own actions and inactions which contributed to these divisions we ask your mercy. Forgive us, Lord, and make us new. Send your reconciling love into our lives and communities to heal divisions and restore relationships. Compel us to work daily for a world made new by your redeeming love. AMEN!**

First Lesson

Reader A reading of Job chapter 38, verses 1 through 7.

The Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?"

Unison Reading

Reader Let us read in unison Psalm 104, verses 1 through 9 and 25.

All **Bless the Lord, O my soul; O Lord my God, how excellent is your greatness! you are clothed with majesty and splendor. You wrap yourself with light as with a cloak and spread out the heavens like a curtain. You lay the beams of your chambers in the waters above; you make the clouds your chariot; you ride on the wings of the wind. You make the winds your messengers and flames of fire your servants. You have set the earth upon its foundations, so that it never shall move at any time. You covered it with the Deep as with**

a mantle; the waters stood higher than the mountains. At your rebuke they fled; at the voice of your thunder they hastened away. They went up into the hills and down to the valleys beneath, to the places you had appointed for them. You set the limits that they should not pass; they shall not again cover the earth... O Lord, how manifold are your works! in wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. Hallelujah!

New Testament

Reader A reading of Hebrews chapter 5, verses 1 through 10.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Gospel

Mark 10. 35-45

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Celebrant James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Sermon

Nicene Creed

Celebrant Let us join in the words of the Nicene Creed.

All **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became**

truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. AMEN!

A// Jesus, guide us in your Way of Love.

Reader Savior, you came into our midst that we might know life. Embolden us to GO among those who are weary, burdened, sick, or imprisoned, that we might live like you, crossing the boundaries that divide rich from poor, sick from well, and sinner from saint.

A// Jesus, guide us in your Way of Love.

Reader Lamb of God, in your death you destroyed death and taught us the way to eternal life. Compel us to daily die to self and REST in your grace. May all who have died rest in peace and rise in glory.

A// Jesus, guide us in your Way of Love.

Reader We lift up the special needs and concerns of this congregation.

A// Jesus, guide us in your Way of Love.

Reader Lord Jesus Christ, who gave your life for the life of all, we commit our lives to following you. Continually guide us in your way and draw us in to live as your Beloved Community in this age and in the age to come; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

A// AMEN!

Reader We pray to you also for the forgiveness of our sins.

A// Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. AMEN!

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

Celebrant Let us join in prayer for all those who have celebrated or will be celebrating their birthdays.

All O God, our times are in your hand: Look with favor, we pray, on your servants as they begin another year. Grant that they may grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen their trust in your goodness all the days of their life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN!

Celebrant Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.

All **By his blood, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.**

Celebrant And therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

Celebrant And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take... eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving,

A// **We celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.**

Celebrant Lord God of our Fathers and Mothers: God of Abraham and Sarah, of Isaac and Rebekah, of Jacob, Leah, and Rachel; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

A// **Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.**

Celebrant Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation.

A// **AMEN!**

Celebrant And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

A// **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN!**
