NEW! MLK Freedom School Fall 2021 series

The MLK Freedom School is in honor of Rev Dr Martin Luther King Jr and Mrs Coretta Scott King and their civil and human rights legacy. Events will detail the central focuses of the Kings's lives and how their contributions inspire poor and working people today to build a better world. There'll be featured speakers from Wisconsin and across North America and opportunities to become engaged in today's civil and human rights activities. 11/18—PEOPLE'S NEEDS, NOT PRISONS AND WARS: Combined, the amount of tax dollars spent on prisons, bank bailouts and wars by the U.S., state and local governmental entities is hundreds of billions of dollars. Dr. King in his April 4, 1967 "Beyond Vietnam" speech, said: "A nation that continues year after year to spend more money on military defense than on programs of social uplift, is approaching spiritual death." This event will highlight the King's steadfast opposition to wars that only benefit the rich. Peace and anti-war activists from Wisconsin and beyond will raise up their activities focused on ending poverty, racism and war.

12/9—VOTING IS A HUMAN RIGHT! STOP RACIST ATTACKS: The basic democratic right to vote is under increasing Jim Crow style attacks in Wisconsin and across the United States. These attacks include ever more restrictive voting laws and gerrymandering. The King's work to ensure voting rights included numerous protests, marches and the 1965 Voting Rights Act that is always under threat of being overturned. Voting rights activists will highlight the King's work and engage participants in defending our democratic right to vote today.

Help with Salvation Army adopt-a-family

Yes, once more St James has the privilege of participating in the Christmas Salvation Army Adopt-a Family program. This is our 4th year! Our congregation, even in "unusual" times like the pandemic, is amazingly generous. Thank you!!! I (Karleen Cole) am coordinating this year.

This year we have two small families; one is a mother and three children (2 girls ages 13 and 8 and a boy age 6), and the other is a mother and father with a daughter age 11. You are provided with a "Wish List" for your person with sizes and colors.

The Salvation Army asks that a minimum of \$50 be spent on each individual. This is no small amount, so we encourage you to team up and go together to select gifts for your person. Smaller donations of gift cards are also appreciated (you can use Scrip!) that can be given which the Army uses for individuals.

On Sunday, November 7, I will have the cards at church to distribute for the individual family members. If you won't be able to be at the service, please contact me (info below), and I will

deliver it to you. On Sunday, November 28 the gifts are due back at church. Please don't bring them in early—I am happy to pick them up from you, if needed. Also, if you are unable to go out and shop, I can shop for you. Individual gift cards of any amount will also be collected on November 28.

The Salvation Army asks that gifts are unwrapped, so parents have the opportunity to wrap them themselves. Donations of wrapping paper, tape and ribbon are much appreciated.

Remember: If you cannot (or do not want to) come to the church to pick up a name and/or return the gifts and you want to participate, but do not want to be out shopping, please, please let me do it for you.
