Our building is receiving some much-needed nurture with replacement of our Sanctuary roof and other work that is expected to start this week.

As 2020 began, none of us anticipated the challenges: a pandemic with our county and state currently among the highest rates; the need for racial healing and justice becoming ever more evident, including in our community; increasing political divisiveness. Remaining physically apart to help slow the coronavirus spread has been difficult for all of us—even the introverts! But using the resources of our time and place, we've found ways to continue to be the hands, feet, and face of Christ to each other and to the world.

On the sides of the tree are many of the sub-goals that we have made progress on throughout the past year, connected by arrows to their related major goal(s) on the three. We are grateful to you all for the ways you have contributed your time, talents, and financial resources to make all of this happen. Some of our initial plans moving into 2020 got turned sideways, but the Holy Spirit used the pandemic to help us make progress on many other goals.

In addition to financial support, we were able to gift Painting Pathways Clubhouse use of our lower level for 6 months during construction of their building.

We have continued to offer weekly and periodic opportunities to discover and grow in faith, facilitated by a variety of people.


We've updated and expanded our congregational resource list, used to help us respond when a need arises within the congregation.

Offering varied ways for people to participate throughout the week/month, including using phone, internet-enabled devices, or print materials.

Daily social media posts have generated engagement. Twice-weekly mailing list communication of events, information, and news (also posted on our web site).

Weekly updates from Vestry in St James Weekly as well as congregational mailings every 6 weeks or so.

Based on previous building assessments and emergent needs, put in motion a variety of building repairs including replacement of sanctuary roof.



Our new branded merchandise with our logo, mission, and vision, helping us express what makes us unique.

Celebrated the mission, service, and ministries of individuals, by inviting them to share these experiences to educate and encourage others. (starting this before the pandemic, and will resume in a video format in the near future).

Added recorded Worship services on Facebook and YouTube during pandemic, which we'll continue to do after. This is a way non-local people or those who cannot attend a service can participate with us.

Our congregational Core Values, Mission, and Vision are at the forefront of our worship, music, and liturgy.

We've been developing and using additional special liturgies in response to events and special themes.

Mirroring our user-friendly bulletins, our recorded services are edited to include all the words and song lyrics the people need to participate.

New leadership and collaboration in Bible studies and other Discover & Grow programs; new first-time additions to the Vestry; additional worship leaders.
