- Thank you for your continued financial support throughout 2021. Our annual stewardship report and 2022 pledge cards will be included with the deliveries we are preparing after Worship on December 12 and available in church after that.
- Meeting to take place after 10AM Worship on Sunday, January 30, 2022. At this meeting we review and celebrate our progress, discuss goals, review our budget, and hold elections for Wardens, Vestrypersons, Trustees, and Convention delegates and alternates.
