Vestry Notes-updated 10/9

- We welcome Jerry Molitor to the St James Episcopal Church community. Jerry is in the ordination process in our diocese, and Bishop Matt has assigned him to St James for practical experience.
- Materials have been ordered for our roof replacement and related building work. We expect to know a time frame for the project soon.
- Bishop Matt's visit to St James had previously been scheduled for Sunday, December 13. Most likely that will need to be in some virtual format this year. We'll share more information when it's available.
- Manitowoc County Covid-19 total positive cases was at 1618 as of October 9, up from 1342 on October 2. Current active cases increased to 975, with 5 deaths. Our county and northeast Wisconsin remain among the highest spread in our nation. Local and state health departments continue to urge making use of proper precautions and limiting non-essential travel.
