Wi-Fi access: Look for our networks beginning with **CBCI-77B0** and enter password **build7443guitar**; we encourage you to share pictures and posts on social media.

Worship/Liturgy Sources: Our worship is based on the *Book of Common Prayer* (BCP--the red hardcover book in the pew rack), the *Book of Occasional Services*, the *Enriching Our Worship series*—the primary liturgical resources authorized by General Convention of The Episcopal Church—supplemented by occasional other resources. You may find additional prayers in the BCP on pages 832-834 helpful for personal devotion before, during, and after worship (especially prayers 64-69 and 57-61). If you'd like a BCP for your own use at home, the church can provide one for you—please talk to Amma Diane.

Children: Children of all ages are welcome in worship! Activity bags are available in the back of the church. A changing station is available in the restroom in the atrium just outside the sanctuary.

Hearing Loop: Our Hearing Loop system enables people with hearing loss to better hear sounds through our sound system. If you can set your hearing aid to a T or M/T setting, audio from our sound system will be received directly by your device (70% of aids have this feature). If your aid does not have this option, or you do not wear a hearing aid, there are a few portable headsets available in the back of the church.



Please share your prayer requests with us: All are invited to share their prayer requests so that the entire congregation may join in lifting up your needs and thanksgivings. Please add requests to the Prayers of the People clipboard (you can simply use first names on requests... God knows our needs). If you'd like a prayer lifted up for multiple weeks, please fill out a prayer request slip found at the back of the church.

We worship with our bodies: You'll notice that some of us may sit, stand, and kneel at various points in the service. Some of us may make the sign of the cross or bow now and then. Some may clap, raise their hands, or tap their feet. All of these movements are traditions from various parts of our Christian heritage—none are required, none are frowned upon. All are welcome to express whatever movements they might find meaningful in worship. Some instructions are printed throughout this bulletin—you may also observe what others do. None of these movements are a requirement: if you prefer not to use them, don't worry about it—God doesn't.

Restrooms/Layout/Accessibility: A handicapped-accessible restroom is located in the atrium just outside the sanctuary (next to the elevator.) Another restroom is located on the lower level. The atrium gives access to the lower level and upper level by stairs or elevator. The worship space and chapel are located on the upper level. The offices, fellowship hall, library, and classrooms are located on the lower level and marked by signs.

Companion Diocese Sunday

Celebrant Today we celebrate the relationship between our diocese, the Diocese of Fond du Lac in The Episcopal Church and our companion diocese, the Diocese of Masvingo in the Anglican Church of Zimbabwe. Both are part of the global Anglican Communion, rooted in the Church of England. A companion relationship helps strengthen the Anglican Communion and strengthen one another.

The Republic of Zimbabwe is a landlocked country with a population over 16 million. There are sixteen official languages spoken, with English being one of the primary languages, used for education and legal systems. Drought and erratic rainfall, a ruined infrastructure, and an economy in collapse mean millions of people still can't grow enough food to survive. Until food insecurity is properly addressed, outbreaks of diseases will continue to claim lives.

The high prevalence of HIV (about 14% of the population) is a key barrier to development. About 70% of the population rely on farming for their livelihoods, but HIV-related illnesses prevent them from working. Zimbabwe has the highest rate of HIV orphans in the world, with one in four children having lost one or both parents to the disease.

The Diocese of Masvingo is located in the southeast corner of Zimbabwe, bordering South Africa and Mozambique. Masvingo is the fifth and newest diocese in Zimbabwe, established in 2001. Let us pray.

People **O God, who created all peoples in your image, we thank you for the wonderful diversity of races and cultures in this world. Enrich our lives by the ever-widening circles of fellowship, thru our companion relationship with the Diocese of Masvingo in Zimbabwe and the Diocese of Fond du Lac in Wisconsin, USA. Help us to learn about each other to grow in love for each other. And show us your presence in those who differ most from us, and allow us to learn from each other with open hearts and minds; through Christ our lord. AMEN!**

First Lesson

Reader 1 A reading of Acts chapter 11, verses 1 through 18.

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

Reader 1 Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

Let them praise the Name of the LORD, whose Name only is exalted, and whose splendor is over earth and heaven. The LORD has raised up strength for Israel and praise for all loyal servants, the children of Israel, a people who are near God. Hallelujah!

New Testament

Reader 2 A reading of Revelation chapter 21, verses 1 through 6.

I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them as their God; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away." And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life."

Reader 3 We pray for this community. God who came to earth as one of us, help us see you in each member of this community. Bless the many gifts of our members and keep before us the image of the Servant Jesus, that joined with him we remain ready to kneel with basin and towel before each other and before those you continue to bring into our midst. For our community we pray:

People **Be with us and help us, O God.**

Reader 3 We pray for all who suffer. God of compassion, open our hearts to bind and heal in your name. Bless all of those who ask our prayers, and give us courage to learn the names of others. Be present, through us, to those who need your comfort. We remember those on our prayer list and others we name now silently or aloud. For all who suffer and struggle, we pray:

People **Be with us and heal us, O God.**

Reader 3 We pray for all who have died. God who has loved us from before birth and God who loves us beyond the grave, we remember those who have died in the glorious hope of the resurrection, and we remember those who mourn, that they may be assured with that same hope. For all who have entered new life in Christ's resurrection, we pray:

Reader 3 Receive our praise and thanks for all your blessings, and for other prayers we raise. For confidence to offer all our needs and concerns up to God, and for growing gratitude in all we receive, we pray:

Reader 3 Let us confess our sins to God.

Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. AMEN!**

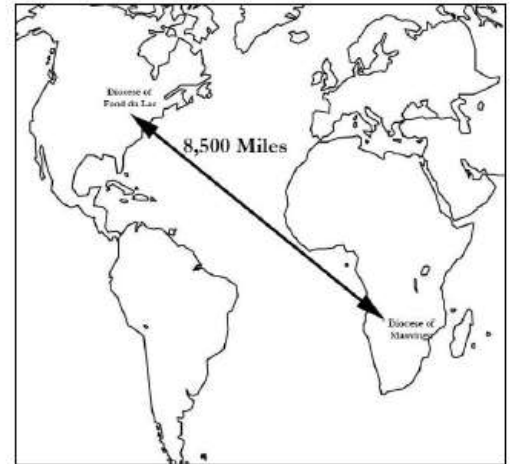

Diocese of Masvingo and Fond du Lac

The Diocese of Masvingo (ma – SHEEN go) is the fifth and newest Anglican Diocese in Zimbabwe, established in 2001. The Diocese of Fond du Lac was established in 1875 out of the Diocese of Wisconsin.

Zimbabwe, (zihm BAH bway), formerly called Rhodesia, officially the Republic of Zimbabwe, is a landlocked country in Southern Africa between the Zambezi and Limpopo Rivers. Most of the country is high plateau. Mt. Nyangani is Zimbabwe’s highest point at 8,514 feet. The extreme eastern part is mountainous and is known as the Eastern Highlands. This area supports tropical evergreens and hardwood forest. Zimbabwe lies in the tropics but has a pleasant climate because of the high altitude. Zimbabwe’s summer lasts from October to April. Summers are hot and wet, winters are cool and dry.



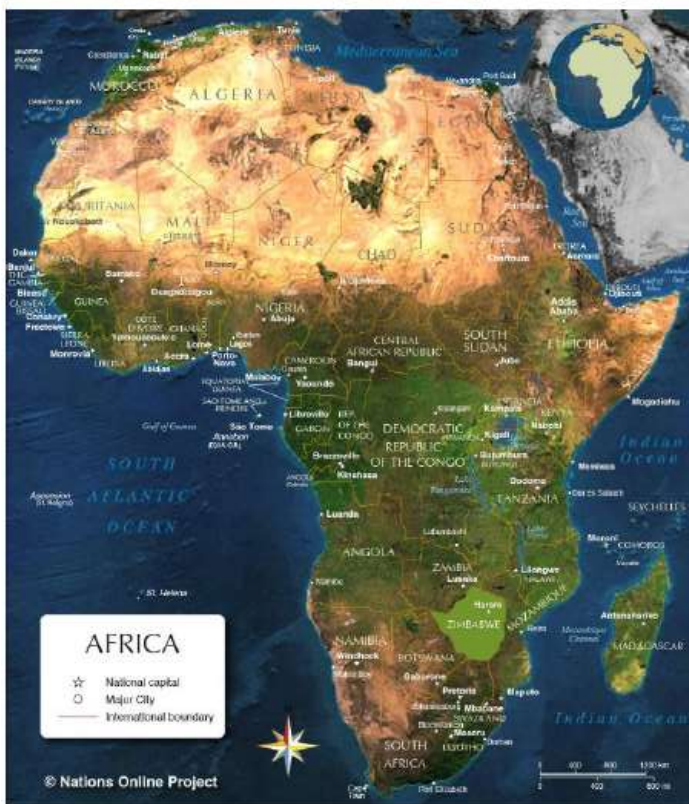
Zimbabwe has a centralized government divided into eight provinces with 16 official languages. English, Shona, and Ndebele are the most common. Some 85% of Zimbabweans are Christian. The largest Christian churches are Anglican, Roman Catholic, Seventh-Day Adventists and Methodist. The Diocese of Masvingo has the The Arthur Shearly Cripps Shrine in Maronda Mashanu. Cripps was known as the ‘St Francis of Assisi of the African countryside’.

The **Diocese of Masvingo** covers the central south portion of Zimbabwe, Fond du Lac the northeast third of Wisconsin. Masvingo has 22 churches, additional mission stations and 15 Diocesan schools, hospitals and clinics, Fond du Lac 37 worshipping locations. Masvingo covers about 40,000 square miles, Fond du Lac 18,000 square miles.

The total population in Masvingo is about 2.2 million, Fond du Lac 1.5 million.

Two issues face the diocese. Food insecurity comes from drought and erratic rainfall patterns, a ruined infrastructure and an economy in collapse. HIV prevalence of 13.7% of the population is a key barrier to development. 70% of the population rely on farming for their livelihoods, but HIV-related illnesses prevent them from growing the harvest they need. Zimbabwe has the highest rate of HIV orphans in the world, with one in four children having lost one of both parents to AIDS.
