#### **Vestry Notes**

- As of April 31, our year-to-date income is \$23,278, on a YTD budget of \$30,323 (a shortage of \$7,045). Year -to-date expenses as of April 31 are \$33,865 on a YTD budget of \$36,516 (a savings of \$2,651). We currently have a year-to-date deficit of \$10,585, which is more than our budgeted YTD deficit of \$6,193. Thank you to all our members and friends for your generosity and faithful stewardship!
- The Diocese of Fond du Lac will hold Summer Camp with a hybrid of in-person and at-home for those age 4 through 12th grade. If you or a child you know are interested in attending, visit diofdl.org/camp.html or talk to Amma Diane if you have any questions. Financial assistance is available.
- SAVE THE DATE: The Rev'd Deacon Jerry Molitor has been working with our congregation since September 2020. Jerry is a transitional deacon on the path to ordination as a priest in the Diocese of Fond du Lac. God willing and the people consenting, Jerry will be ordained July 10 at our Cathedral Church of St Paul in Fond du Lac. Additional details will be shared when they become available.

### Annual Meeting 6/27

As we've announced starting April 5, our Annual Meeting is scheduled following Worship on Sunday, June 27. The meeting will take place in the Sanctuary with the same guidelines as in-person Worship. There will not be food/ snacks, so we will try to keep the meeting brief.

2020 Annual Reports were delivered to homes in February. Extras are available at the church, or contact Amma Diane if you need one delivered to you.

We will elect Wardens/Vestry (church council), Diocesan Convention delegates and alternates, and a church Endowment Trustee. Information and nomination forms were available in church starting May 16. Advance nominations should be returned by June 13 (nominations are permitted from the floor.)

Vestry update: Tammy McVeigh is completing her 2nd one-year term (of up to 3) as Senior Warden; she is eligible to be re-elected for another year; Tammy is retiring from the Vestry. Chris Eggert-Rosenthal is completing her 2nd one-year term (of up to 3) as Junior Warden; she is eligible to be re-elected for another year; Chris will be a nominee for Senior Warden. Mary Green (2020) is completing a full 3-year term as Vestry Member; she is ineligible to serve another term as Vestry Member; she is ineligible to serve another term as Vestry Member but may serve in other positions; Mary will be a nominee for Junior Warden. Peggy Turnbull asked to step down in 2020 so that she could concentrate on the work of Treasurer. Richard Hall (2021), Kim Kaufmann (2021) and Nick Doszkewycz (2022) will continue their Vestry Member terms in the coming year.


#### Hunner Preserve

Mark Hunner shares the following story:

"Over 30 years ago Sally and I bought 55 acres of property near Tisch Mills, comprised of 50% pine and cedar plantation as well as 50% native conifer and hardwood forest. The land is bisected by Tisch Creek, a beautiful spring-fed stream bordered by native ferns. Over the years I worked at thinning the plantation areas to allow Nature to reclaim what was previously cropland.

"In order to preserve in perpetuity this beautiful stream and woodland, in late 2020 our family decided to donate 40 acres of property to Glacial Lakes Conservancy. The public can now walk, ski and enjoy this beloved land and water, all part of God's Creation."

Mark wants to let the people from St James know that if any individuals or small groups would like to visit the property and see the land, Mark would be more than happy to give people a tour/walk of the property. Contact Mark and Sally (920-755-2213) if you'd like to arrange a time and date.

Glacial Lakes Conservancy, Inc (glaciallakes.org) is a private, non-profit land conservation organization. The original founders saw that during the 1990's, approximately 8,000 rural acres were subdivided for residential purposes in the unincorporated areas of Sheboygan County alone, prompting a deep concern for the future of our region's lands and waters.

This realization prompted the founding of the Sheboygan Area Land Conservancy in 1996. Originally, an all-volunteer organization with a goal of serving to protect and preserve natural areas and farmland within the Sheboygan Country area in Wisconsin.

In January 2005, Glacial Lakes Conservancy (renamed in 2004), expanded its coverage area northward to Kewaunee County. This was accomplished by merging with The Rural Land Legacy Committee of Kewaunee County, an active local group dedicated to preserving farmland, natural areas, and undeveloped Lake Michigan shoreline.

Today, the land trust offers land conservation options, organizational support, and technical guidance to landowners and organizations in a five-county region, Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Kewaunee, Calumet and Fond du Lac. GLC owns five properties: William F. Christel Woods and Wetlands Preserve, Grasshopper Hill Preserve, Charles & Winifred Spring West Twin River Preserve, Willow Creek Preserve, the Hunner Preserve, and also holds 26 conservation easements.
