Reader 2 For Esther and Deborah, saviors of their nation, and for all who dare to act courageously at God's call... for Hannah and Ruth, and all who through love and devotion witness to the faithfulness of God... and for Isaiah, John the Baptist and all the prophets, and all who speak the truth without counting the cost...

People We thank you and praise you, O God.

Reader 3 For Mary, the mother of Jesus, and all who obey God's call without question... for Andrew and John and the first disciples, and for all who forsake everything to follow Jesus... and for Mary Magdalene, Salome and Mary, first witnesses of the resurrection, and for all who bear witness to Christ...

Reader 1 For Anselm and Richard Hooker, and for all who reveal to us the depths of God's wisdom... for Benedict and Francis, Hilda and Bede, and for all who deepen our common life in Christ... and for Julian of Norwich, Bridget of Sweden and Teresa of Avila, and for all who renew our vision of the mystery of God...

People We thank you and praise you, O God.

Reader 2 For Thomas Cranmer and all who reform the Church of God... for Thomas More and all who hold firm to its continuing faith... and for Gregory and Dunstan, George Herbert and John Keble, and for all who praise God in poetry and song...

Reader 3 For Lancelot Andrewes, John Wesley and Charles Simeon, and for all who preach the word of God... for William Wilberforce and Josephine Butler, and for all who work to transform the world... and for Monica, and for Mary Sumner, and for all who nurture faith in home and family...

Remembering Our Baptism

Celebrant

Here in this community of those who seek God, we know we are not saints. We are wrapped in those strips of words, thoughts, and actions which bind us to sin, not to God. But God has promised us new hope, new life, and fresh mercy if we will but confess. I invite you to join me, as we pray together:

We come to you, Listener of our broken lives; our hands soiled with the pain we have caused; our ears stuffed with the words of those who speak falsely; our hearts stained with those lusts and hungers we would be embarrassed for others to know. Forgive us and have mercy on us, Wiper of our tears. As we seek to journey from the baptismal waters towards the feast you prepare in glory, may we turn our faces towards you in every moment, listen to your words in the depths of our hearts, and follow Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, every step of the way. Lift up your heads, saints of God! Your sin is gone; your hands—once full of foolishness—are now empty. God has clothed you with garments of joy to wear to the feast.

Our former life has passed; new life in Christ has begun. All things are new—including us! Thanks be to God, for we are forgiven!

Celebrant

O God, with confidence we remember your promises to us—in baptism, we are reborn to eternal life. Those saints who have gone before us, including those we remember today, have fulfilled their baptism and are now celebrating in your presence.

People

Thanks be to God.

Celebrant

Blessed are you who divides the waters so plants and beasts of sea and sky and plain could thrive; who draws us from the water in birth and rebirth; who claims us with a love from which nothing can separate us. Blessed are you, Holy One. Come now, God, and send your Spirit among us; trouble for us this water of memory and imagination. Send your Spirit to enliven our praise, to strengthen our hands, to guide us in work and play, in service and love, to assure us once more of your love.

Sisters and brothers, remember your baptism, and know once again that you are claimed by God forever. There is no reason any longer to be afraid. The Spirit moves among us. Let us worship and praise God!

Reader 3 Remember in your mercy all those gone before us who have been well-pleasing to you from eternity; preserve in your faith your servants on earth, guide us to your kingdom and grant us your peace at all times.

All God, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Reader 3 Hasten the day when many will come from east and west, from north and south, and sit at the table in your kingdom.

All God, in your mercy: hear our prayer.

Reader 3 We lift up the special needs and concerns of this congregation.

All God, in your mercy: hear our prayer.
