This month's Split-plate recipient will be at our Friendly Forum, Sunday, November 10 at 10:30 a.m. in Room 113: **Cambodia Reads** is a 501(C) 3 project that began in 2011 and is located in rural Cambodia in the village of our founder, Pov Judd. Our educational program augments the rural Cambodian school program that meets four days a week for half days only without instructional materials, where attendance is not monitored and class size averages 50-60 children. CR provides a welcoming atmosphere where children of all ages are invited to receive instruction in reading, writing, math, hygiene, singing, playing games, constructing with Legos and how to enjoy learning. In addition to teaching

basic skills, our goal is to help prevent early dropouts as children are often needed to work at home, to educate parents and village elders of the importance of school and to enrich the lives of the children. All of this is under the tutelage of two dedicated teachers and is monitored by a board of eight Frederick members.
