Latest Permit Regulations for visiting the Andaman Islands

- A total of 41 islands can be visited without Restricted Area Permit (RAP). Of these, only day visits are allowed to 11 islands. However, the Andaman Administration has not operationalized mechanisms to visit many of the islands on the list and they remain practically out of bounds on the ground as on date.
- As applicable for all foreign nationals entering India, foreign nationals must carry a valid Indian visa and have passports valid for at least 6 months after the date of exit.
- Any foreign national staying for more than 180 days must be registered with FRO Port Blair within 14 days of arrival.
- Citizens of China and foreign nationals of Chinese origin require special permission to visit Andaman Islands and cannot enter the territory without prior approval of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India. If there is a stamp on their visa that reads, 'not valid for restricted areas' or similar, they will need to contact the issuing embassy.




Airlines Connection to Port Blair

Currently, there are direct flights from Chennai, Kolkata and Bangalore only and one-stop en route all flights from Mumbai and Delhi.

About Ferry Options

All the private ferries normally connect Port Blair, Neil and Havelock. The sectors are subject to change, depending upon factors such as load, sailing, service and maintenance. Sailing on the Neil Island sector is seasonal and not constant from May to September.

Green Ocean

Green Ocean operates two ferries- Green Ocean 1 and Green Ocean 2. Green Ocean is the first and the only all-weather deep-sea vessel in operation between Port Blair and Havelock. Passengers may also buy snacks and beverages.

M.V. Makruzz

M.V. Makruzz is the first privately owned luxury catamaran in the Andaman islands. This vessel plies between Port Blair and Havelock and is also available for charter. The two decks can accommodate 280 passengers and there are three classes – 208 seats in Premium, 64 seats in Deluxe and 8 seats in Royal. The vessel is fully air-conditioned. M.V. Makruzz meets the latest global safety parameters.

Sea Link India Private Limited is another luxury option for consideration. The ship can accommodate 200 guests and has an upper and a lower deck, classified into Business, Premium and Premium Plus classes.

The Business Class (Upper Deck) has 27 seats, the Lower Deck Front Position Premium Class has 84 seats and the Lower Deck Aft Position Premium Plus Class has 100 seats

Cuisine

The Andaman is a paradise for seafood lovers and there is a huge variety of crabs, lobsters, prawns and fish to look forward to. Rice is the staple here due to large-scale paddy cultivation. Coconut, along with fruits such as mango, sapodilla, banana and pineapple is also commonly grown. Being a cultural melting pot, the Andamans also offers a wide range of culinary choice, including Bengali and Andhra food. Similarly, the abundant use of coconut, spices and coconut oil reveals a strong Kerala influence. One may also enjoy North Indian cuisine and Mughlai food. Most of the popular restaurants are located in Havelock and Port Blair.



Art and Craft

The main handicrafts in Andaman are made from the raw materials found in the islands, such as forest products and marine life. Padauk, Badam and Gurjan are the main varieties of useful timbers. Canes and bamboo are commonly found too. Marine life includes coral, driftwood, shells and seaweeds, with tortoise and turbo shells being quite popular. Exotic wood crafts, ornaments from sea-shells and palm mats are much sought after.

Woodwork and carpentry are the local crafts of Andaman. Furniture and other wooden articles are made from ornamental woods such as Marble Wood, Padauk and Chui. The tabletops made from Paduak burr are singular works of handicrafts in these islands. Beautifully crafted statues are also made. Cane is largely used for making baskets and furniture.

The shell crafts include ashtrays, lamps, buttons and jewelry made from the polished, decorative shells. Tortoise shell is used in table lamps, boxes and decorative items. Similarly, coconut shells are used in finger bowls, table lamps and other products.

PORT BLAIR



Port Blair, the capital and gateway to the Andaman, lies on the east coast of the South Andaman Island. The Aberdeen Bazaar is at the heart of the city and most of the hotels and restaurants are situated here. This island town offers lots of water sports activities and some interesting glimpses into the history and culture of the region.

CELLULAR JAIL

Built between 1896 and 1906, the Cellular Jail was used by the British to incarcerate Indian freedom fighters. The structure is entirely made up of individual cells for 'solitary confinement', and that's how it got the name, 'Cellular Jail'. After independence, it was turned into a 'National Memorial'. Today, the entrance block houses a 'Freedom Fighters Photo and Exhibition Gallery' on the Ground Floor. The first floor has an Art Gallery, Netaji Gallery and a Library on Freedom Movement.



CORBYN'S COVE

The tiny palm-fringed Corbyn's Cove beach is a welcome change from the city life of Port Blair. There are facilities for watersports or one may simply relax on the silvery sands. Other facilities such as hotels, restaurants and changing room are also available. The famous 'Snake Island' is situated just across the beach and attracts scuba diving enthusiasts. The way to the beach passes by several Japanese WWII bunkers.



SOUND AND LIGHT SHOW (CELLULAR JAIL):

The past seems to come to life through this show. Various artists enact the life of prisoners, when the Cellular Jail was operational. It's a wonderful opportunity to witness the saga of the heroic freedom struggle. The show is held in both Hindi and English.




ROSS ISLAND

A part of the Port Blair Islands, the Ross Island is home to interesting colonial-era ruins. Many of these ruined structures have been engulfed by wild vines and tree roots. Now, officially known as the Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Island, it used to be a major British stronghold and a penal colony. Some of the buildings have been beautifully rebuilt and radiate the ambiance of a long bygone era.

The beautiful red 'Padouk' wood, found only in Andaman, has been extensively used to build the hotel.

There is a wide choice of rooms such as the air-conditioned Deluxe, Premiere, Luxury rooms and the Royal Suites. The rooms are specially handcrafted with red timber furniture built entirely of padauk wood found in the Andaman Islands. Scrumptious food is served at the world-class Zest (Ala-Carte) multi-cuisine restaurant and Jalsa (Buffet restaurant).

Munjoh Island House

(Upcoming 4* property by May 2019)

Munjoh Island House is an All-Suite Resort and Spa, nestled amidst gently swaying coconut palm, betel, mango and banyan trees, and even a jackfruit tree. This unique hillside resort brings back luxuries from a bygone era. It's the only five star resort in Port Blair with elegant villas and individual configuration of rooms. 

DISCOVER SCUBA DIVING

Going scuba diving with experienced divers is akin to discovering a different new world altogether. Discover Scuba Diving is perfect for beginners as it's not a scuba certification course, but a quick and easy introduction to the underwater world. One has to be at least 10 years old and in reasonable physical health.



SNORKELING

Swim with the wonderful creatures inhabiting the gorgeous waters. Brush past giant turtles, and fish, big and small; view the rarest of corals and other sea-creatures as you enter this little explored part of the world. If you haven't tried snorkeling before, give it a go and you will know what you have been missing!



STAND UP PADDLING

The highly exciting sport of Stand Up Paddling can be enjoyed on Surfing-grade Paddle boards at Radhanagar or at Beach No. 5 depending on the time of the year- pre-monsoon and post monsoon. An instructor provides guidance on technique and skills first on land and then in the water, before you go into the shallow waters on your own. Experienced paddlers are led on a SUP trip through the cove.





BIRDWATCHING WITH A NATURALIST

The Andaman Islands are home to a very large number of endemic bird species. There are lots of popular birding trails in the vicinity of Port Blair (e.g. Sippighat, Chidiya Tapu, Mt. Harriet) and Havelock Island. An experienced birding guide/naturalist accompanies visitors to the key birding locations and assists in spotting, identifying and photographing different species and subspecies.



DAY KAYAKING

A short, guided kayaking tour in Havelock is the perfect way to experience the island's unique marine eco-system and spectacular mangrove scenery. An experienced team guides visitors through the mangroves at the jetty and explains the importance of these mangroves. You will also spot some delightful terrestrial and marine life.



TREKKING

The islands are full of marvelous hillocks and rain forests, offering wonderful trekking opportunities. All you need is a basic level of fitness and comfortable trekking accessories.

Taj Exotica Resort And Spa 5*





BHARATPUR BEACH

Located just about 0.5 km from the jetty, the picturesque Bharatpur Beach is one of the most spectacular beaches in Neill Island. A sprawling stretch of sand and greenery overlooks a vast expanse of the blue sea, while exotic marine life flourishes in the colorful coral reefs – a glass-bottomed boat ride offers an up close view of the corals. Also, the shallow waters are perfect for swimming.



LAKSHMANPUR BEACH

Situated in Lakshmanpur Village, this pristine white shell sand beach strikes a sharp contrast against the gleaming blue seas. Corals and sea shells can be found in abundance, while the shallow waters present excellent snorkeling opportunities. Sunbathing and swimming are amongst the other popular activities here. The mesmerizing views from the beach are at their picturesque best when the sun sets in the distant horizon. Magnificent natural rock formations are the main attraction.

AMKUNJ BEACH

Ideal for sunbathing and swimming, this sandy beach lies on the way to Cutbert Bay, barely 100 meters from the main road (ATR). Amkunj Beach has been developed in a unique way with eco-friendly structures such as log sofas, log teapoys, and eco-huts and groves named after local floral life. It is located at a distance of about 08 km from Rangat towards Mayabunder and about 1 km from the Nimbutala helipad.



DHANNINALLAH MANGROVE NATURE WALK WAY

Billed as the longest walkway of its kind in the whole country, the Dhaninallah Mangrove Nature Walk is a wooden boardwalk meandering through mangrove creeks for a distance of about 713 meters. The Walkway leads to a captivatingly beautiful long beach called Dhaninallah Beach, well known for turtle nesting. This walk offers exhilarating views of Andaman's diverse mangrove eco-system and has halts at intervals.



Hotel Priya International (Basic)

Hotel Priya International is a business hotel with 20 well-furnished rooms across four different categories. The hotel's location facilitates a tour of Diglipur (the last point of North Andaman) in a single day. Food is served at the in-house restaurant.



DIGLIPUR ISLAND



Situated in the North Andaman Island, Diglipur is well known for its oranges, rice and marine life. Kalpong, the only river of Andaman, flows here. Saddle Peak, the highest point of the archipelago in the Bay of Bengal, is also situated nearby. The simplicity of village life is palpable in Diglipur and the town touches a deep chord. The destination is roughly 325 km from Port Blair.



KALIPUR BEACH

Famous for turtle nesting, Kalipur Beach is one of those rare beaches in the world, where four types of turtles – Hawksbill, Olive Ridley, Green and Leather Back turtles – lay their eggs. The forest department has provided facilities for turtle nesting here. The beach has signs of volcanic black sands.



SADDLE PEAK TREKKING

At 732 meters, Saddle Peak is the highest point of Andaman Islands. It takes around 6-7 hours to complete the whole trek. On a clear day, the peak commands fabulous views of the vast blue sea – Kalipur Beach, Craggy Island, Lamia Bay – on one side and dense forests on another. There are two trails, one through the beach and another through the forest. An early morning hike on the beach trail offers stunning views of a glorious sunrise. The path runs by streams, sandy patches, coastal rocks, gigantic tropical forests, villages and watch towers.



ROSS & SMITH ISLANDS

Ross and Smith are two islands joined together by a sand bar to make a single group of islands. It takes around 30 minutes to reach the islands on boat from the Ariel Bay Jetty. The gem-green waters are absolutely crystal clear and the sunny beaches are perfect for sunbathing. During high tide, the natural sand bar dividing the islands disappears, leaving just a trail of water between them. It's an amazing sight. The island has a marine sanctuary and there are facilities for scuba diving as well as snorkeling.






